PARKS

- Cassel Hills Pool winterization continues with water lines and addition of antifreeze.
- Earth moving equipment is onsite and in operation at the Robinette Park splash pad and parking area locations. The storage area in the restroom building has been cleared out in preparation for their work.
- We have begun broadleaf weed control at select sites in the City.
- Exterior building maintenance has been completed at the Facility Maintenance Garage.
- Assisted with set up, hayrides, and tear down at the Fall Festival.
- The main driveway lighting at the Sports Complex failed. An apparent lightning strike caused some electrical issues, which Building Maintenance Staff have addressed.
- Replaced the 13 Recreation Center banners with new banners. Thank you to Public Works for the use of their bucket truck.

TREE CITY USA / URBAN FOREST

- A median was struck by a vehicle. The plants survived, but two solar lights did not.
- Four shade trees on the south side of the Robinette Park playground were installed, and two evergreens were
 planted at the Sports Complex behind the information banner fence. We also planted shrubs and perennials at
 various locations, as needed.
- In the National Road streetscape, east of I-75, eight stumps are being removed in preparation for eight new trees.
- Landscape maintenance included weeding of some of our landscapes, control of honeysuckle, poison ivy, etc. at the Helke park disc golf area.
- Working on our 2025 Tree City USA application.

RECREATION

- The January April 2026 Program Guide: Staff are working on their programs and other recreation initiatives.
- We are in the final stages of regaining Spectrum service at the VRC. This has been a long process, but glad things are getting resolved. The next steps is to wait for installment of new equipment.
- Aaron met with Alicia McCracken on Wednesday, September 24, to discuss and plan a VPRD Business Continuity Plan, needed if we were ever to experience a cyber-attack.
- Rudy Wells, Jerrod Hill, and Aaron Messenger met with Travis from Water Boys Construction on Friday, October 17, to discuss the potential for a water feature replacement in the VRC Pool. They did a walkthrough, and Travis will send us a quote for the work.

- Recreation Coordinator Maecie Burkhardt attended "The Supervisor Program" on October 21 and 22. The Supervisor
 Program focused on effective supervision strategies that are useful for day-to-day challenges of being a Supervisor.
 The two-day program was designed to be engaging with job embedded opportunities for growth. This program
 was delivered by individuals who shared personal and real-world experiences.
