



Council Action

In an effort to increase awareness and understanding, this publication was created to detail and explain the actions of the Vandalia City Council. We hope this promotes a better understanding of the role Council plays in keeping Vandalia a great place to live, work and play.

Council took the following actions at the Monday, May 18 meeting:

- ✓ Approved Resolution 20-R-30 authorizing a contract with LJB, Inc. for part one of the design and engineering of the bikeway extension from Cassel Hills Golf Court to the Great Miami River Trail. Part one entails a feasibility study to evaluate the most cost-effective route for the bikeway. The cost of the feasibility study is \$119,230.
- ✓ Approved Resolution 20-R-31 authorizing an intergovernmental agreement with Montgomery County Building Regulations Department for inspection services, on an as-needed basis. The agreement is for a three-year term with an inspection fee of \$50.
- ✓ Approved Resolution 20-R-32 authorizing the purchase and installation of an emergency generator at Fire Station #2. The cost to purchase the Kohler KG60 generator is \$24,421 from Buckeye Power Sales, the sole source provider for this type of generator in the area. The cost to install the generator is \$24,915.06 as quoted by Sparks Electric. The total project cost is \$49,156.
- ✓ Approved in its first reading, Ordinance 20-09, amending the Income Tax Code to comply with HB 166 passed by the State legislature in the summer of 2019. The changes deal with amendments to certain definitions.
- ✓ Approved in its first reading, Ordinance 20-10, for the reissuance and sale of Bond Anticipation Notes related to the 2016 purchase of a new rescue engine. The remaining principal balance on these notes will be \$288,000.
- ✓ Approved in its first reading, Ordinance 20-11, for the reissuance and sale of Bond Anticipation Notes for the land at Stonequarry Crossings purchased in 2006. The remaining principal balance on these notes will be \$1,399,000.
- ✓ Approved in its first reading, Ordinance 20-12, for the reissuance and sale of Bond Anticipation Notes related to the 1996 bonds issued for the Recreation Center/Justice Center/Municipal Building projects. The remaining principal balance on these notes will be \$808,000.
- ✓ Denied a request for a conditional use request for a warehouse at 9105 Peters Pike.
