City Services

SNOW REMOVAL

A few tips for you that will help us do our best in clearing snow from the roadways: When snow is heavy enough for the plows to be out, please do not park vehicles in the street. Also, when shoveling driveways and sidewalks, do not move snow onto the street. City ordinances require property and business owners to keep their sidewalks clear of snow. When a snow storm strikes, the city manager can declare a snow emergency. When a snow emergency exists, the law requires all parked vehicles be removed from City streets within 12 hours.

BULK ITEM PICKUP

Free pickup of extra-large trash items is available weekly through the City's contracted waste hauler, Rumpke. Homeowners must call Rumpke at least 72 hours in advance, (937) 461-0004, to advise what items need to be removed.

Bulk drop-offs at the City Garage, 97 Clubhouse Way, are available the second Saturday of several months, 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. These drop-offs are limited to limbs, brush, and large construction materials. This service is not available in January, February, November or December. For more information, call (937) 415-2349.

WASTE REMOVAL

Residents of Vandalia are provided with refuse collection for a nominal monthly fee. For information regarding pickup days in your neighborhood, call (937) 898-3750. In addition, every home receives a plastic bin for the recycling of glass, metal cans, cardboard, some plastics, and newspaper. These items are picked up along with household trash.

Yard waste may be placed in your regular trash bin or in any trash bag for pickup on your regular trash collection day. There is no longer any requirement to place your yard waste in a special bag or to separate yard waste from the rest of your trash. Brush should be in bundles no larger than 2' x 4'. Limbs larger than 6" in diameter will not be accepted. Rumpke will pick up leaves through the months of November through March. Please put the leaves in plastic bags and place them out at the curb to be collected on your regular trash pickup day. Please... no more than two bags per week.

BR MULCH

Residents in Vandalia may also take brush, limbs, and trees that are smaller than 12 inches in diameter to BR Mulch, 620 Ginghamsburg Road, Tipp City. Those using this free service must show proof of residency. For hours of operation, call BR Mulch, (937) 667-8288.

UTILITIES

Charges for water usage, wellfield protection, sewer and waste water treatment, storm water management, mandatory trash pickup and curbside recycling are billed monthly and mailed out to residents. Payment can be mailed or dropped off at the Municipal Building's drive-through window from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. weekdays, or the 24-hour dropbox, located next to the drive-through window. For your convenience, the City offers an automatic bill pay option. Customers can register for automatic bill pay by completing the form on the back of the utility bill statement or by accessing the form on the City's website, www.vandaliaohio. org. Automatic bill pay allows residents to have their utility bills automatically deducted from a checking or savings account. Information on other payment options is available on the website. In lieu of a paper utility bill, residents may receive email notifications concerning their utility account. Visit our website and click on the Finance Department tab; choose Utilities Division and then "View Utility Bill."

GOLF COURSE

Vandalia's renowned and challenging golf course, Cassel Hills, runs through Taylorsville Reserve. The course is located at 201 Clubhouse Way, east of I-75. The course is open for play year-round, weather permitting. In peak season, the golf course opens at 8 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday, and 7 a.m. Friday, Saturday and Sunday. The course opens at 9 a.m. on Tuesdays so that crews can complete golf course maintenance. Times are adjusted seasonally. Find current information (including course status and golf cart availability) at the web site, www.casselhills.com, or call (937) 890-1300 during normal business hours. Greens fees range from \$8 to \$27, depending on residency or if you hold a current Season Pass. Golf carts rent for \$7 per rider for 9 holes and \$13 per rider for 18 holes.

PERMITS/REZONING

The City requires permits for improvements such as small buildings, fencing, decks, patio covers, pools, hot tubs, fireplaces, heating and cooling, signs, satellite dishes, sewer or water system repair, and sidewalk, curb or driveway approaches. If you're not sure you need a permit, call Development and Engineering Services, (937) 898-3750.

Also, if you'd like to use your property in a way that is prohibited by its zoning, you may request that the zoning be changed. The decision to rezone land must be justified by public necessity, convenience or general welfare.

PARKS AND RECREATION

The Vandalia Parks and Recreation Department (VPRD) offers more than 200 recreational programs and classes throughout the year. Seasonal programs are listed in a brochure published periodically. If you would like to receive a copy in the mail, please call the VPRD, (937) 890-7709. Copies are also available at the Recreation Center front desk. Information on seasonal programs can also be found online at www.vandaliaohio.org under the Parks and Recreation header. Follow us on Facebook and Twitter for program information as well.



SENIOR CITIZENS

The Vandalia Senior Center is operated under the administration of the VPRD. Through this organization, the City offers many types of recreation, education, and companionship for adults 55 and older. The center is located at 21 Tionda Drive South. For more information, call (937) 898-1232.

PICNICS AND PARTIES

Vandalia residents may use the shelters at Helke Park or the gazebo in Seger Park for parties, picnics or special events. These services are for Vandalia residents only. Call the VPRD, (937) 415-2353 to reserve space or equipment.

If you'd like a living reminder of a special person or event, you may want to look into the VPRD's Commemorative Tree Program. Through this program, you can remember a friend or relative with a tree, the symbol of life. For a minimum cost of \$120, the VPRD will plant a tree in a City park and place your

honoree's name on a plaque that hangs in

MEDIA

Focus Vandalia is a locally-produced video program which features City of Vandalia news. The program is designed to keep Vandalia residents informed of important issues, programs and trends taking place in the City. Programming can be found on Dayton Access TV, which airs on Spectrum Cable Channel 5. The package that airs on DATV includes the most recent television episode, plus the most recent City Council meeting. The shows are broadcast four times each month. The schedule is as follows:

Living in Vandalia

The COVID-19 pandemic took center stage throughout much of the year as Vandalians navigated a "Stay at Home" order, and tried to make the best out of a summer of cancelled events. Among the events cancelled were: the Vandalia Corporate Challenge, the Star Spangled Celebration; the Art Park season opener; the Citywide Garage Sale, the annual Shred Day, the Vectren Air Show and Air Show Parade; the Taste at the Crossroads; and the National Night Out Against Crime.

Vandalia made a push to encourage residents to sign up for Hyper-Reach. The free service calls registrants with important information in the event of an emergency. Those interested in signing up should visit VandaliaOhio.org and click the Living Here tab.

Vandalia joined forces with Butler Township and the Vandalia-Butler School District to create a joint newsletter. The CommUNITY Connection features information of interest to the entire Vandalia-Butler community.

Division of Police

The Division of Police in 2020 implemented an Endangered Missing Adult and Children Program (EMAC). This program offers residents the opportunity to voluntarily share information, including photos of themselves or a family member who may have disabilities, mental health challenges, or similar health concerns. This information is available to assist officers during a missing persons investigation.

VPD is increasing training to focus on officer response to high-stress calls for service, de-escalation techniques, verbalization methods, and officer safety tactics.

Two Youth Explorer meetings are held every month. The meetings are held on the first and third Tuesdays at 6pm. The Youth Explorer Program offers youth an opportunity for handson learning of law enforcement related activities for ages 14-20 who are interested in a law enforcement career.

Economic Development

The Vandalia Commercial Facade Improvement Program launched over the summer. The program is designed to help local businesses improve their building appearance through grants. The grants can cover up to 50% of the costs of eligible building improvements.

Leaders from throughout the region attended a kickoff event for a project that will widen US Route 40 west of Airport Access Road. The project is expected to ease traffic congestion by increasing capacity and encouraging trucks to avoid driving through the center of town.

Vandalia partnered with the Vandalia-Butler Chamber of Commerce to present a webinar on loan and grant programs in place to assist businesses impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Vandalia Eats" was a local program that made people aware of which local restaurants were open for carry-out service during the Governor's "Stay-At-Home" order.

Finance Department

The majority of the Auditor of State's Office 2019 Audit was completed remotely. This presented challenges, as large amounts of paperwork typically handed to the auditors needed to be scanned and e-mailed.

The City of Vandalia received the Auditor of State Award with Distinction for fiscal year 2019. This marks the 31st consecutive year that the City has received this award. The award means that the City has timely filed the report and there are no findings for recovery.

Vandalia utility customers have the option of signing up for online ACH payments, which eliminates the need to write monthly checks. Customers can also opt for paperless billing, which sends your monthly statement in a convenient e-mail format.

Public Works

The Public Works Department utilized a split schedule during the first few weeks of the pandemic. The staff was split into two groups, which worked on alternating days. This reduced the risk of an infection wiping out the entire crew. Those working were required to social distance and wear masks.

The Public Works Department continued work on the Foundation Drain Disconnect program. The program reimburses homeowners 80 percent of the costs up to \$1,200 to disconnect their foundation drains from the sanitary sewer line. Public Works crews perform drain inspections for EPA compliance and then extend storm sewers and provide a lateral connection.

In an effort to control the growth of unwanted vegetation in the roadway, curbs and gutters, the Public Works Department sprayed weed control chemicals throughout the City. A small utility vehicle equipped with a spray tank allowed crews to efficiently apply the herbicide.

Parks and Recreation

A project to replace all outdoor lighting at the Sports Complex with more efficient LED lighting is nearly complete. All pole lights, with the exception of the ball diamond lights, are now LED. These lights provide a higher-quality light and requires less maintenance.

Austrian Pine trees at some park locations are starting to die as the result of a fungus. Parks and Recreation staff are closely monitoring the situation and will remove the trees as they fail. Trees that die will be replaced with Eastern Red Cedar trees, which are native to southwest Ohio.

Several commemorative trees were planted this spring. The street trees along National and Dixie were pruned for roadway clearance and low limb removal.

Building maintenance staff were able to complete several projects during COVID related building shutdowns. Improvements were made at the senior center and the recreation center.

Development & Engineering

At the height of the pandemic, Development and Engineering Services staff met with the public by appointment only and postponed inspections not deemed critical. The DES lobby was closed to the public while the Stay at Home order was in effect.

New watermains were installed and individual services lines reconnected on Brindlestone Drive and Marview Avenue in 2020. The old water lines were brittle and subject to frequent breaks.

The 2020 street resurfacing project was completed over the summer months. The \$385,000 project allowed crews to resurface more than a dozen streets. Curbs and concrete repair were also a part of the project.

Neighborhood drainage projects were completed on S.Tionda Drive and Adeline Avenue. The work was necessary to eliminate issues with standing water.

Division of Fire

In March of 2020, the Division of Fire implemented its flu response & continuity of operations plan in response to the COVID pandemic. Fire Stations were closed to the public, crews were confined to quarters, enhanced PPE protocols, disinfecting and cleaning protocols, and self-medical evaluations were put into place.

The Division of Fire continues to require enhanced PPE on every EMS contact and continues to execute enhanced cleaning and disinfecting procedures.

The Division of Fire continues to promote social distancing in the fire station and while crews are out in the community performing non-emergency functions.

The Division of Fire's Five Year Strategic Plan was implemented January 1. Action steps identified in the plan have been initiated and several of the goals and objectives are being met.



Bruce Sucher Recreation Center

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Recreation Center was closed to the public on Monday, March 16. The Center reopened under new operational guidelines on Tuesday, May 26.

Fitness classes were highly impacted by the pandemic, as the group fitness studio did not offer enough social distancing space. More than 60 different classes were moved to the gymnasium. Frequently asked questions

Q: I need to pay a traffic ticket. Do I still go to the Municipal Building?

A: No. Since June 1999, the Vandalia Municipal Court has been located in the Justice Center, 245 James E. Bohanan Memorial Drive (on the west side of the Post Office). The Municipal Building now houses only council, administrative offices, finance and development and engineering services.

To pay a traffic ticket, you can go to the Justice Center, or pay online at www.vandaliacourt.com

Q: Where are the Parks & Recreation offices located?

A: The Parks & Recreation offices are located within the Vandalia Recreation Center, 1111 Stonequarry Road.

Q: I would like to participate in the annual Citywide Garage Sale. Does the City coordinate it?

A: Although the City sets the date for the garage sale — usually the third weekend in May — and advertises it in the annual report, there is no coordination involved. Citizens simply advertise their sales and enjoy the increased "traffic" that city wide publicity brings.

Q: I am a business professional working in Vandalia. Where can I get more information about how Vandalia can help me?

A: The City Manager's Office has detailed information on business and industrial recruitment and retention, local business, property availability, tax incentives and more. Much of this information can be accessed by visiting the City's website, www.vandaliaohio.org. You may also want to call the Chamber of Commerce, 898-5351.

Q: My group would like to have a float in the Air Show Parade. Does the City organize the parade?

A: While the City is very much involved in the Air Show Parade, the event is actually organized by the Vandalia-Butler Chamber of Commerce. If you'd like to participate, call the Chamber, 898-5351.

Q: Does the City handle marriage licenses?

A: No. To obtain a marriage license, you must go to the Marriage License Bureau, 41 North Perry Street, Dayton. For more information, call 225-4656.
