And Next School Year...

At this time, district officials are looking forward to a return largely to normal. For example, carpets will be back in elementary classrooms, and students will be allowed to sit together for group work once again.

Also, all water fountains are being replaced with water-bottle-filling stations, and comprehensive cleaning will continue, as these measures have

likely improved the schools' overall health environment.

Contact tracing requirements will likely still be in place, along with new guidance/ guidelines from the Ohio Department of Health.

School District: 'We Did It – Together!'

As the school year ended, one Vandalia-Butler teacher received a note of appreciation for the district's COVID-19 response. A parent wrote, "Millions of children did not get a good enough education this year. Mine did. Thank you."

The district completed 37 weeks of school last school year, with all but eight days being in-person learning. Significantly, school officials received no reports of COVID-19 infections resulting from school-related activities, including sports and extracurriculars.

"We offered a full spectrum of extracurricular activities, and a complete course offering allowed our students to excel academically," said Superintendent Rob O'Leary. "We started in school, and we stayed in school."

Athletes completed in three full seasons, including 3,000 practices and 800 contests. District records were broken, state qualifiers emerged and swimmer Matt Brunsky became a state champion.

The class of 2021 received high praise, having set a new record by earning \$10 million in post-secondary scholarships. Their senior year culminated with a welcomed change: a traditional, in-person graduation ceremony at the high school.

Credit for the success of this most incredible and challenging school year goes to many.



"On behalf of the Vandalia-Butler City School District and our Board of Education, I want to thank our students, parents, community members, and staff for the incredible support," said the superintendent. "We courageously moved forward – together. We met every challenge – together."

City Tackles Truck Traffic Woes

When Vandalia residents are asked about the city's most pressing issues, a common response is truck traffic clogging surface streets.

But trucks support a healthy economy, and so it's important to learn to coexist with these large vehicles. Here is how the City is approaching the problem:

Enforcement of commercial truck laws and regulations. Vandalia police are trained to quickly spot violations. With increased awareness, they can address these issues through written warnings and citations.

Prohibition of trucks turning left onto National Road from Dixie Drive.

Traffic engineers have determined there is not room for trucks to safely navigate that turn.

Limiting commercial vehicles to right lane on National Road. Signs alerting drivers to this requirement were posted in April 2021.



Reducing speed limit. National Road's speed limit between Dixie and Ranch View drives has been reduced to 25 miles per hour.

Encouraging alternative routes. The City is reaching out to companies that program guidance systems, requesting that interstates and access roads be suggested for trucks not delivering inside the city limits.

Unfortunately, the issue of large trucks using Vandalia roadways will likely continue as new warehouse locations open around the airport. City officials are committed to finding ways to keep truck traffic at manageable levels.

"We thought if we could get those vaccines right to your door, you're less likely to wait or less likely to skip it," said Vandalia Fire Chief Chad Follick.

The program is open to all agequalified residents of the two jurisdictions. A Public Health worker accompanies paramedics to provide the vaccine.

City Unveils New Logo

In early 2021, the City of Vandalia engaged a design firm to help update the city's identity with a new brandmark and message. The previous logo, which focused on the city's proximity to the Dayton International Airport, communicated nothing about the community's distinct character. Also, the tagline, "Crossroads of America," has been the Indiana state motto since 1937.

Through a citizen-driven process to determine what sets Vandalia apart, leaders heard residents describe the city as a connected community of welcoming people with vibrant, accessible amenities, in a place to call "home."

With this direction, the design firm developed a new brandmark, civic identity and message.

"The three lines on the 'V' convey the brand positioning as a connected, vibrant, accessible Vandalia," said City Communications Manager Rich Hopkins. "The new tagline reflects the personal and professional growth opportunities here."

The new brandmark will appear on printed materials, city communications, vehicles, signage and more.

New Crisis Intervention Counselor Hired

South Community Inc. has hired a new counselor to help Vandalia and Butler Township police when they encounter individuals in crisis.

The community's Mobile Crisis
Response Program counselor, Kristina
Hill, is now riding along with on-duty
patrol officers and responding to
calls. She responds to calls in which
individuals need social services or
referrals for issues such as addiction,

homelessness and domestic violence. She also follows up with those who have been counseled to ensure they're pursuing the services they need.

Hill's experience is extensive: She worked as a victim advocate for the city of Dayton Prosecutor's Office in the Victim Assistance Coordination Unit, and a social worker and mental health specialist for Lindner Center in Mason, among other positions involving



homelessness, addiction and community mental health.

Hill earned a bachelor of science degree in psychology – with a minor in criminal justice – and master's degree in social work, both from the

University of Cincinnati. She has also participated in ride-along programs with police in Hamilton and Cincinnati.

Hill replaces Michael Spirk, who is pursuing a career with the FBI.

Police Join to Offer Citizens' Academy

The Butler Township and Vandalia Police departments are collaborating to offer their first joint Citizens' Police Academy this fall, provided for free to residents of the two jurisdictions. The eight-week program promotes communication and builds greater understanding among citizens and police departments.

Participants attend a two-hour session once a week during the Academy and are also encouraged to ride along with an on-duty officer. Topics include about department histories, patrol

functions, uses of force and SWAT, evidence collection and investigations, K-9 demonstrations, and "shoot don't shoot" simulations, among others.

Class size is limited. Applicants must be at least 18 years of age and are required to submit to a background check.

Registration packets and more information are available at the Vandalia or Butler Township Police offices or online at vandaliaohio.org, or butlertownship.com.

The registration deadline is August 1, 2021.
