

Organization Meeting:

Oath of Office – City Law Director Gerald McDonald will administer the Oath of Office to Mayor Herbst, Councilmember Aivalotis-Weaver, Councilmember Doogan and Councilmember Follick.

Nominations and Election of Vice-Mayor – Council will nominate and elected the Vice Mayor, who will be given the Oath of Office by the City Law Director, Gerald McDonald.

Nominations and Appointments of Council to Committees – At the December 18th Study Session, Council discussed the nominations and appointments of Council to Committees. In this discussion, it was agreed upon for each Councilmember to remain on the Board/Committee they are currently serving on, with the exception of the Vandalia Development Corporation, which Councilmember Aivalotis-Weaver will be appointed to serve on in the odd years.

Setting of Meetings: Under Charter Section 3.4 every 2 years Council is to set their regular meeting schedule – Council will confirm that the Council meetings will continue to be on the first and third Monday at 7 pm, except for the Summer Session meetings, which are held on the 3rd Monday in June, July and August.

Resolution: Firefighter Protective Clothing - The Division of Fire budgeted (\$50,000) for the replacement of twelve sets of firefighter protective clothing in 2024. Our vendor has agreed to hold our 2023 "state pricing" until February 1, 2024. The Division of Fire is asking City Council to review its request during its workshop on January 2, and then to take action to purchase twelve sets of firefighter PPE at the January 2nd meeting to avoid a significant price increase. These sets are replacing sets of PPE that are at or approaching the end of their "useful lives as front line PPE", as defined by the NFPA guidelines, an industry best practice.

Resolution: Replacement of Shift Supervisor Vehicle – The Division of Fire budgeted (\$50,000) for the replacement of twelve sets of firefighter protective clothing in 2024. Our vendor has agreed to hold our 2023 "state pricing" until February 1, 2024. The Division of Fire is asking City Council to review its request during its workshop on January 2, and then to take action to purchase twelve sets of firefighter PPE at the January 2nd meeting to avoid a significant price increase. These sets are replacing sets of PPE that are at or approaching the end of their "useful lives as front line PPE", as defined by the NFPA guidelines, an industry best practice.

Resolution: ED/GE Agreement - On December 12, 2023 the City of Vandalia was awarded a \$150,000 ED/GE grant for MLC, Inc. an Ohio corporation dba Electro-Polish, through the Montgomery County Fall 2023 ED/GE Program. Electro Polish intends to purchase the facility located at 6161 Ventnor Avenue, conduct renovations, and purchase new machinery and equipment. These proposed renovations include updating the office area, adding a state-of-the-art wastewater treatment system, and adding air pollution control. The company, a metal finishing company, would invest approximately \$12.3 million in the project and relocate 30 jobs from their Dayton facility over the next three years. In total, the Company anticipates having 40 employees with a payroll of \$2.6 million annually.

We are asking that City Council adopt a resolution authorizing you to enter into an Economic Development Government Equity agreement with Montgomery County Office of Economic Development and to enter into an agreement with Electro Polish regarding the ED/GE funding.

Tuesday, January 16, 2024 Items:

Resolution: Managed Endpoint Detection and Response Service - In recent years, our city has taken significant strides to bolster network security and safeguard data against potential threats. In 2023, we introduced SentinelOne, an advanced antivirus utilizing AI for virus, malware, and external attack prevention. Despite a year without incidents, we aim to enhance cybersecurity in 2024 by considering a 24/7 monitoring and response layer through a third-party cybersecurity company, aligning with practices akin to fire alarm or security monitoring services. Challenges arise from limited IT staff availability during regular business hours, affecting our responsiveness to after-hours attacks and compliance with continuous monitoring requirements. Evaluating managed endpoint detection and response services from FortiEDR, Arctic Wolf, and SilverSky, we selected SilverSky due to its unique alignment with our needs, offering a user-friendly interface, compatibility with SentinelOne Complete, and flexibility for gradual system integration. For the 2024 budget, we propose shifting SentinelOne licensing to SilverSky, incurring a \$19,639.34 annual increase for a three-year term, totaling \$33,300 per year, with an initial setup fee, resulting in a recommended total cost of \$34,687.50. Given SilverSky's compatibility, features, and phased expansion approach, we recommend council approval for a three-year MEDR services agreement, waiving formal bidding.

Council Meeting:

Action Item: 2024 Council Appointments to Board/Commissions - Council will consider annual appointments for the following organizations:

- 2024 MVRPC & TC Representatives: Annually a representative and alternate are appointed to the MVRPC. Currently Mayor Herbst is the representative and Rob Cron is the alternate. Annually a representative is appointed to the Technical Committee. Ben Borton is the current Technical Committee representative.
- 2024 First Suburbs Consortium of Dayton: Annually Council appoints two representatives and an alternate to this consortium. The current representatives are Mayor Herbst and Councilman Ahlers. Vice Mayor Lewis is the alternate. At the December 18th Study Session, Council recommended appointing Councilmember Doogan and the newly elected Vice Mayor as the alternate.
- 2024 Montgomery County Community Improvement Corporation: This committee requires the annual appointment of the Mayor.
- 2024 Vandalia Development Corporation: This board requires two councilmembers appointments one Council appointment to be made in even years, the current Council Representative is Councilmember Blakesly.

Resolution 24-R-01: Stop Eight Road Resurfacing Agreement with Montgomery County Engineers Office – Assistant City Manager Cron is recommending entering into an agreement with the Montgomery county Engineer's office for the resurfacing of Stop Eight Road from Webster Street to I-75. The City of Vandalia's southern corporate boundary falls approximately on or around the centerline of Stop Eight Road. The Engineer's office has requested that we enter into a "Participatory Agreement" to share the cost of this work proportionally by the amount of work that falls in each jurisdiction. As part of our pavement assessment program, we agree that this section of roadway is in need of resurfacing and that it makes sense to have it all resurfaced at the same time. Montgomery County will be soliciting bids for their project in January of 2024.

Resolution 24-R-02: Firefighter Protective Clothing - The Division of Fire budgeted (\$50,000) for the replacement of twelve sets of firefighter protective clothing in 2024. Our vendor has agreed to hold our 2023 "state pricing" until February 1, 2024. There are exciting things that could be coming in 2024. The City of Vandalia is in a strong operating position with a diverse and solid economy. There are strong employers who could be joining our community. We have strategic policy and comprehensive planning documents that are setting the course for achieving our long-term goals, in-depth financial forecasting, and fund balances that will allow us to invest in improving how we do business. Right now, WDC Group is working to plan and to design the new public works facility on land that was donated to the City. This could be out for a bid and award in 2024 with construction to follow in 2025 - 2026. We are in the final stages of reviewing the City's downtown market study – which is going to recommend that we put a strong focus on residential development and redevelopment to build the necessary mass to support sit down restaurants, shops, and other amenities.

The City has awarded contracts to extend water and wastewater utilities west of Dog Leg Rd. to provide utilities across our entire corporate boundaries. We will continue to chip away at the Vandalia Bikeway Connector from Bunkers to Taylorsville Metro Park. We have awarded a contract, and by the end of May, we should see great progress on the upgrades to the signs at our gateways, parks, and facilities. Vancon General Contractors will be building a restroom in Robinette Park, and the City has capital funds designated for an inclusive playground and will seek approval this year. It won't be long before we will be advertising for competitive bids to build-out the stage and amphitheater seating at Art Park because of state capital grant funds that the City was awarded. Finally, we have completed the design of the golf course irrigation system and could see a contract be awarded for construction in late 2024 / early 2025.

2023 has been a year of strategic planning and execution. I am thankful for the opportunity to lead this team, and to build on a great tradition of service at the City of Vandalia.
