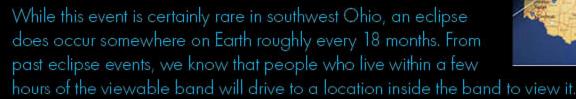
## Total Solar Eclipse Monday, April 8, 2024

Special Study Session - Tour Tri-Cities Wastewater Plant: Thank you to Councilmembers Follick and Aivalotis-Weaver, along with several staff members, for attending our special study session and tour of the Tri-Cities Wastewater Treatment Plant. General Manager Danny Knife gave an in-depth explanation of the plant's major functions, the Environmental Protection Agency mandates, the planned plant upgrades, and the history of the plant since it was built in 1985.



Sunshine Laws Certification Training 03.27.2024 (Vandalia OH): Mrs. Swartz has coordinated a sunshine laws certification training course through the office of State Auditor David Yost. The training will take place on Wednesday, Mar 27, 2024, at 9:00 AM - 12:15 PM in the Vandalia-Butler High School Lecture Hall. This course provides the mandatory three (3) hour training required by Ohio Rev. Code § 109.43(B) to be completed by elected officials or their designee once per elected term. Mrs. Swartz is the designee of the Vandalia City Council. Councilmembers, senior staff, administrative staff, and department deputies are invited to participate.











MyVandalia Magazine (click to view online flip book): The May – August 2024 edition of the My Vandalia Magazine is starting to arrive in mailboxes. Kudos to Communications Manager Hopkins and the team for getting this publication out ahead of schedule. I have enclosed a copy.

**Water Meter Installation:** Public Works has installed 1,600 new water meters to date – with approximately 4,100 to go.

**Right-of-Way Mowing:** Development and Engineering Services met with the Property Worx contractor to set expectations and plans for mowing of public rights-of-way and some of the City owned properties.

**Finance Department Presentation:** Thank you to Director Leiter who provided an insightful Finance Department update at the most recent study session.





Federal Funding for Tri-Cities North Regional Wastewater Authority (TCA): TCA General Manager Danny Knife reported this week that he was contacted by Senator Sherrod Brown's office to verify that Congress officially appropriated \$750,000, for FY2024, towards our plant improvement project. This will cover 60% of the planning phase engineering. Congressman Turner and Senator Brown worked together on getting this funding. I appreciate Mr. Knife working with our team to go the extra mile and raise federal funds for our plant upgrades – this is truly a top-tier approach to utility provision and protecting the interests of our utility customers.

**Carbon Monoxide Alarms Donation:** The Division of Fire is excited to be the recipient of fifty donated Carbon Monoxide alarms. Local Firefighters and Company Credit Union donated the alarms. This donation will allow us to continue to provide free alarms to our residents who need one.

Parks Maintenance Technician Supervisor Recruitment: The Parks Maintenance Technician Supervisor posting was sent to full-time building and parks employees. Only current full-time employees who are serving in the position of Parks Maintenance Technician (the formal classification for both facilities and parks technicians) will be considered. Human Resources will accept resumes and letters of interest until Friday, March 29. Letters of interest should provide details as to how the candidate seeks to achieve the Parks & Recreation Department Goals and Citywide Policy Goals in the Maintenance Supervisor position. I highly encourage candidates to review the 2023 Parks & Recreation Master Plan.

**Police Recruitment:** Second round interviews were held this week for Police Officer. This is a strong recruitment group and I look forward to issuing conditional offer(s) promptly pending certification by the Civil Service Commission and Appeals Board.

**Fire Lieutenant Recruitment:** Chief Follick and I will interview three second round finalists for the Fire Lieutenant recruitment next week, with a potential fourth candidate to follow in the coming weeks.

The advertisement for the **Recreation Superintendent** vacancy closes Friday, March 22.

**Real Appeal**: I have enclosed the Real Appeal flyer, which is only available to United Health Care subscribers. It is a year-long lifestyle program that uses clinically proven research and an engaging online experience to drive scalable disease prevention and lasting behavior change resulting in weight loss. The program uses on-camera interaction with a coach for 30 minutes, will supply the UHC subscriber with a Real Appeal Success kit, an interactive dashboard, and much more. A flier is attached to this update. This program is free for anyone who is on the City's health insurance program.



**AED's in the Parks Project:** The first AED has been installed at the Sports Complex. This project was made possible through donations by the Vandalia Rotary Club, Vandalia-Butler Optimist Club, and several other private donations.


The **Annual Adult Easter Egg Hunt** will be held on Friday, March 22 at the VRC. The event is sold out with a total of 102 adults registered for the event.

We have experienced growth in our **youth baseball / softball program** with a total of 441 youngsters registered to play compared to 400 in 2023. Our co-ed t-ball program and boys coach pitch league will be in-house with all other divisions

playing in a league with Tipp City and Troy.

Our **Annual Underwater Easter Egg Hunt** will take place this Saturday, March 23 in the Aquatics Center at the VRC. Thus far, we have 56 kids signed up for the program. Kids will search for Easter Eggs in the pool and turn them in for prizes.

There are currently 18 plan holders for the **Art Park Amphitheater Project** Bid. The bid is active on Bid Express through April 12 at 11:00 am. We anticipate presenting a bid award recommendation to Council at the May 6 Study Session. This project is being funded in part by a \$300,000 appropriation through the State Capital Budget.



**Senior Center Attendance!** 1,105 people passed through the doors of the Senior Center between March 5 and March 19. There were 11 days, including evenings and weekends, the facility was rented for usage. There were 930 members who came to the center during this period for an average of 93 members per day for the 10 days the facility was open.

**Golf Irrigation Project:** Technical Choice continues to finalize the specification documents and drawings for the Irrigation System and Pump Control System project. We plan to bid these projects separately to achieve the best bid environment to achieve favorable bid proposals from vendors.

Cleaning and Sign Prep.: Maintenance staff are in the process of cleaning the stone and brick entry way signs (6), golf course, and sports complex signs in preparation for the new lettering to be installed as part of the city signage project. They have also removed shrubs from current sign locations in the parks as needed for the new park signage that will be installed as part of the overall project.

**City Gateway Retrofit and Facility Signage Project:** Director Clark provided Geograph Industries representatives with a signage tour earlier this week so they could GPS the exact locations and mark sites for installation. They are currently in the fabrication stage and plan to provide an installation schedule in the next week. The anticipated completion of this project is May 31, 2024.

Former President Trump / Senate Primary Rally: On March 16, a political rally was held at the Dayton Airport Wright Bros. Aero facility for a U.S. Senate candidate seeking election. The guest speaker at the rally was former President Donald Trump, who spoke to the crowd of an estimated 6,800 people. Lieutenants Walker and Sucher attended several security briefings and meetings with the Secret Service, Dayton Police, event organizers, Dayton Airport officials, and private security detail to organize and plan for site security and traffic control. Our primary responsibility was traffic control and ensuring pedestrians were able to cross North Dixie Drive safely. VPD developed a traffic plan and Butler Township Police assisted through mutual aid. Traffic ran smoothly with little disruption and there were no safety issues. We were able to clear the crowd and parking lots within approximately 45 minutes after the event concluded.

Clyde Place & Cyril Court Reconstruction Project: Milcon Concrete Inc. removed the entire roadway and installed a new gravel road base. Their subcontractor has installed the new concrete curb and begun the driveway approaches and sidewalk sections.

**Street Maintenance:** Public Works crews continued patching potholes and sweeping streets across the City.

**Forty Under 40:** Late last week, the Dayton Business Journal advised me that I was included in the region's list of 2024 Forty Under 40 winners honoring the region's brightest young professionals. I am not so sure about the last part, but I really am humbled by this recognition, and I am thankful to



have received several nominations. It is a privilege to work on this team, and I am truly excited by all the great things that are happening in our community.

**Electric Vehicle Charging Stations:** Garber Electric continues the installation of electric vehicle charging stations at several city facilities. The project is being funded by a 100% rebate of approximately \$320,000 through AES Ohio. The project consists of installing total 16 charging stations at six different locations. Three will be installed at the municipal

building, three at Cassel Hills Golf Course, two at the Justice Center parking lots at Maple & Bohanan, three at the Senior Citizens Center, three at the Bruce Sucher Vandalia Recreation Center, and two at the Sports Complex. Users of the charging stations will pay for the service through an app on their phone, tablet, or other devices. I have included overhead shots showing the locations.

Re: Information Update for March 9-22, 2024

- The highlight of this reporting period was our annual Youth in Government Day event. A special thank you to Zoning and Planning Coordinator, Ben Graham, for putting together the agenda and helping to organize the day. I had the pleasure of spending the day with Jazmin Dysinger who was my counterpart as Assistant City Manager.
- Thank you for attending the Tax Incentive Review Council Meeting in my place as I was out of town on vacation last week. This annual meeting at the Montgomery County Auditor's office is where we report on the compliance of our businesses that are in our Tax Increment Financing (TIF) districts.
- We held our monthly Development meeting March 18<sup>th</sup> with staff from DES, Planning & Zoning and Fire Department to discuss current and potential development projects in the City.
- I attended a meeting with staff from Finance, DES and Public Works for an update on our water meter replacement project. Things seem to be moving along very well and we have over 1,600 of the new meters installed. With Public Works now at full staff for the first time in a while we hope to dedicate more staff time to replacing the meters. Thanks to all staff for helping make this project a success.
- You, Mike Hammes, Ben Graham and I met to review and discuss upcoming Planning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals cases.
- I attended the Special City Council Study Session that was held at the Tri Cities Wastewater Treatment plant to tour the facility. Thank you to TCA General Manager Danny Knife for hosting us and discussing the much needed and long overdue plant upgrades that are currently in the design phase. Danny has worked extremely hard on this and to secure outside funding to assist us with the project.
- Ben Borton and I participated in the DIA Northeast Logistics (Ring Road) project monthly progress meeting with Montgomery County Engineer's office and our design consultant Carpenter-Marty. They are currently working on the drainage portion of the design which has been challenging with the relatively flat topography of the area.
- A pre-construction meeting was held on Friday March 22<sup>nd</sup> with our new mowing contractor, Property Worx. They will be mowing our public right of ways and several City owned properties.

- Congratulations to Communication Manager Rich Hopkins for another outstanding job on our State of the City video that was presented at the Annual Chamber event last week.
- The Popular Annual Financial Report (PAFR) was delivered last week, and we have copies available for anyone who would like one.
- The latest My Vandalia magazine was dropped off at the Post Office on March 19<sup>th</sup> and should begin arriving in homes any day.
- We are scheduled to shoot the April Focus Vandalia videos next week. April's topics will include information regarding the Solar Eclipse, the Arbor Day event, the upcoming water and sanitary sewer extension project that will extend these utilities to the western border of the City, and an introduction to our new Community Rish Reduction Coordinator, Rich Morrett.
- Rich has submitted first round edits for the Community Newsletter. This is the joint newsletter with Butler Township and Vandalia Butler Schools. We expect to have the revised draft available for review next week.
- Rich has also been assisting the Parks & Recreation Department with information items for the Corporate Challenge event.
- We continue to coordinate with all departments and coordinate public messaging regarding the April 8<sup>th</sup> Eclipse events.
- We have secured sponsorships from our three local car dealerships for this year's Star-Spangled Celebration.
- City Planner, Mike Hammes, met with Nicole Ware, our regional representative with AARP, to discuss Age-Friendly Community programs and upcoming events.
- Ben Graham and Mike Hammes performed inspections at 7500 Poe Avenue to investigate on going property maintenance issues at the abandoned facility.
- The Board of Zoning Appeals will meet next week with two variance requests. One is a side yard setback at 1333 Helke Road and the other is a sign variance at 4160 Little York Road.
- The Planning Commission will also meet next week with two items on their agenda. They will have a conditional use application for a hotel at 3675 Wyse Road and a staff-initiated code amendment proposal regarding signage in the Vandalia City Center Overlay district.

### RECREATION/ATHLETICS DIVISION/SPECIAL EVENTS

The ArtBox Grand Opening event took place at Art Park on March 8. Staff conducted a small kickoff party for kids as part of the event. The ArtBox concept is much like that of the Little Free Library program in which the community can visit the box to get craft projects to complete at the park or at home.

Paws in the Park Easter Party at Helke Park took place on Saturday, March 16. This was our first special event of the season. We had over 200 people come out with their dogs to enjoy many dog-themed activities including an egg hunt, dog games and more.

The Annual Adult Easter Egg Hunt will be held on Friday, March 22 at the VRC. The event is sold out with a total of 102 adults registered for the event.

The Kickoff Social for our 35<sup>th</sup> Annual Vandalia Corporate Challenge will be held on Friday, April 5 at the VRC. We currently have 10 businesses planning to attend to learn more about this year's event.

Our youth basketball program concluded on March 9 at the VRC with tournament championship games for the boy's leagues. The girls' divisions finished their season on March 9 as well with final games of the regular season.

We have experienced growth in our youth baseball/softball program with a total of 441 youngsters registered to play compared to 400 in 2023. Our co-ed t-ball program and boys coach pitch league will be in-house with all other divisions playing in a league with Tipp City and Troy.

Recreation Coordinator Jeff Kreill has finalized a partnership with Coaches Tool Chest for our youth sports coach's certification process. The certification program includes 11 modules, each with pertinent information such as CPR/AED, concussion, Linday's Law (sudden cardiac arrest), social/emotional, non-life-threatening issues, medical conditions, nutrition and hydration, parent meetings, and program management.

#### **RECREATION CENTER**

Our Annual Underwater Easter Egg Hunt will take place this Saturday, March 23 in the Aquatics Center at the VRC. Thus far, we have 56 kids signed up for the program. Kids will search for Easter Eggs in the pool and turn them in for prizes.

Spring CampREC is now full as we have 30 campers registered for the week-long program, which will take place during the school district spring break, March 25-29.

The March electronic fund transfer (EFT) for memberships to the VRC totaled \$19,712, which is a slight increase over the February numbers. The revenue for March was \$500 over the collection in March of 2023.

With the assistance of the IT Department, Sharon Hamby has been working on several issues and updates with the new credit card system. There was a training session on March 19 with Vermont Systems that front desk staff attended. The training session was recorded for staff that were unable to attend to review.

A total of 1,105 people passed through the doors of the Senior Center between March 5 and March 19. There were 11 days, including evenings and weekends, the facility was rented for usage. There were 930 members who came to the center during this period for an average of 93 members per day for the 10 days the facility was open.

### FACILITY MAINTENANCE DIVISION

Maintenance staff refurbished and reinstalled the wood memorial sign at the Sports Complex Veterans Memorial Area.

Custodial Supervisor Mark Collins and his part time custodial crew began cleaning carpet at the Justice Center. Areas include the Bailiff Office, Law Library, Prosecutor Office, Probation Offices, Clerks Office, and Jury Room.

There are currently 18 plan holders for the Art Park Amphitheater Project Bid. The bid is active on Bid Express through April 12 at 11:00 am. We anticipate presenting a bid award recommendation to Council at the May 6 Study Session.

I provided Geograph Industries representatives with a signage tour earlier this week so they could GPS the exact locations and mark sites for installation. They are currently in the fabrication stage and plan to provide an installation schedule in the next week. The anticipated completion of this project is May 31, 2024.

Jerrod Hills, Matt Roberts, and Garrett Danner attended the MVRMA Confined Space Training seminar earlier this week.

Maintenance staff are in the process of cleaning the stone and brick entry way signs (6), golf course, and sports complex signs in preparation for the new lettering to be installed as part of the city signage project. They have also removed shrubs from current sign locations in the parks as needed for the new park signage that will be installed as part of the overall project.

Maintenance Technicians Andrew Christian and Bryan Fine are providing in-house training for park staff on trailer usage. They are covering proper transport of equipment, trailer/truck connections, hand on operation of the truck and trailer, and the viewing and discussion of three topic related videos from the MVRMA library.

- During the past week, VPD officers made eight traffic stops on commercial motor vehicles for traffic violations. These stops resulted in one traffic citation, four written warnings and three verbal warnings while working eight additional enforcement hours.
- 2. On March 11, Lieutenant Sucher participated in a Department of Homeland Security webinar dealing with Election Security. This refresher training is offered prior to national election cycles.
- 3. On March 13, Officer Sommer presented "Bank Robbery Response" at Monroe Federal Savings & Loan.
- 4. Detectives charged a 19-year-old Huber Heights man with Abduction (F3), Domestic Violence (M1), and Criminal Damaging (M2). The charges are from an incident where the male would not let his baby's mother out of the car, drove her from the scene, assaulted her, and destroyed her cellphone.
- 5. Detectives charged a 42-year-old Vandalia man with Trespass in a Habitation. The male entered an unlocked apartment, fell asleep (passed out), was awakened by the complainant, and fled the apartment.
- 6. Based upon submission of the CALEA Waiver to the Ohio Collaborative by Accreditation Manager Green, the Division received certification on Group 6 (Positive Youth Interactions, Crisis Intervention) standards on March 14. This completes certification with the Collaborative on all Law Enforcement standards.
- Sergeant Flynn attended an OVI Task Force meeting on March 12. The meeting reviewed upcoming OVI checkpoints and status of the federal traffic grant. The grant reimburses agencies for overtime costs associated with working Task Force hours.
- 8. On March 14, I sat as a panelist during the new police chief's training course held in Westerville. This panel discussion involved topics on recruitment and hiring, responding to, and handling a critical incident, employee discipline, and agency staffing models. There were approximately 50 new police chiefs attending the statementated training.

- 9. Lieutenants Walker, Sucher, and I attended the fourth solar eclipse planning meeting on March 15. We reviewed the citywide incident action plan that includes VPD's operations.
- 10. On March 15, Crime Prevention Officer Sommer represented VPD at a press conference held in Jefferson Township where the OVI Task Force announced an upcoming OVI checkpoint.



- 11. On March 16, a political rally was held at the Dayton Airport Wright Bros. Aero facility for a U.S. Senate candidate seeking election. The guest speaker at the rally was former President Donald Trump, who spoke to the crowd of an estimated 6,800 people. Lieutenants Walker and Sucher attended several security briefings and meetings with the Secret Service, Dayton Police, event organizers, Dayton Airport officials, and private security detail to organize and plan for site security and traffic control. Our primary responsibility was traffic control and ensuring pedestrians were able to cross North Dixie Drive safely. We developed a traffic plan and Butler Township Police assisted through mutual aid. Traffic ran smoothly with little disruption and there were no safety issues. We were able to clear the crowd and parking lots within approximately 45 minutes after the event concluded.
- 12. Chief Follick, Fire Marshall Jacobs, Lieutenants Walker, Sucher, and I hosted a meeting at the Justice Center with Dayton Airport Police Department Chief Wilson on March 18. We shared with him our plans for the solar eclipse and collaborated regarding any possible issues associated with the Dayton Airport.
- 13. Sergeant Nagel and Officer Brazel attended Less Lethal Weapons Instructor training on March 19-20 to renew their instructor certification. This certification provides them with the knowledge and expertise to train our officers on various less-than-lethal weapons systems.
- 14. On March 19, Lt. Sucher completed a training hosted by the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force regarding social media use in investigations.
- 15. Lieutenant Walker and I attended the quarterly board meeting for the R.A.N.G.E. Task Force on March 20. We covered the status of grants that help fund the task force's activities, upcoming training dates, etc. The Division participates in the R.A.N.G.E. Task Force by dedicating one detective part-time. Being part of the task force multiplies our resources to address illegal drug activity and crimes associated with drug activity.

16. On Tuesday, I participated in Youth in Government Day hosted by the City, Butler Township, and the Vandalia-Butler Board of Education. This event offers high school students the opportunity to job shadow a government counterpart to learn about the daily duties and tasks of their job as well as how government functions to serve the community. My counterpart was Scarlett Chambers, who served as "police chief" for the day and learned the responsibilities and role of police chief. Scarlett is a high school junior who plans to study forensic science in college and play soccer. She has an interest in pursuing a police career in the future.



- 17. On Wednesday, Lieutenant Walker and I met with Dayton Veterans' Administration Police Chief Chad Harris to discuss what services the V.A. offers to veterans in our community, and he provided a resource guide for various social and mental health services at their Dayton campus.
- 18. You and I conducted second round interviews with seven police officer applicants this week and will seek the top candidates to proceed to the background investigation stage.
- 19. On Thursday, I was an evaluator for capstone presentations offered by police supervisors attending the Police Executive Leadership College (PELC) training in Dublin.
- 20. Our staff wants to offer a special "thanks" to Christian Hahn and his staff from Joseph Airport Toyota and Nissan for providing Olive Garden lunch to us on Thursday to show their appreciation for our first responders. Their generosity and thoughtfulness are greatly appreciated.

### **Development & Engineering Services**

On the Clyde Place & Cyril Court Reconstruction project, Milcon Concrete Inc. removed the entire roadway and installed new gravel roadbase. Their subcontractor, Oglesby Construction Inc., has installed the new concrete curb and begun the driveway approaches and sidewalk sections.

Redwood phase 1 is down to two (2) remaining units still needing Certificates of Occupancy (COs). These final 2 COs are being held until the remaining Zoning/Engineering items are completed.

Redwood phase 2 is being assembled for permit issue. A couple items are still outstanding from their design team.

The building at 626 W National Rd is being revitalized back into a church. Permits are issued and inspections are in the process.

Coate Construction LLC began this year's curb/sidewalk program project on March 18<sup>th</sup> at Glenrose St and Royalton Dr.



Inspections continue at the new Ernst Concrete corporate office at 993 Falls Creek Dr.

Jeremy Games joined our team as the full-time construction inspector for Engineering and Beverly Snider joined our team as the part-time administrative assistant for DES on March 18<sup>th</sup>.

Chris Mastrino, Robert Martin, yourself, and I met and interviewed an electrical inspector. A conditional offer was sent and accepted for this electrical inspector position. The new employee will be joining our team to backfill a department vacancy with Chris Mastrino's promotion to Chief Building Official.



# Johnson Station Road Bridge to be replaced

The City of Vandalia was awarded more than \$1.5 million in funding for a bridge replacement project slated for 2027.

The Ohio Department of Transportation awarded a grant in the amount of \$1,382,327 for the replacement of an aging bridge on Johnson Station Road, just off Little York Road. The City was also awarded a \$200,000 grant to offset the design and engineering costs associated with the project.

The City of Vandalia's share for the \$1,642,982 project will be \$60,655.

Vandalia City Council approved the contract for this project at the February 5, Council meeting.









## **Cassel Hills Pool Memberships**


Memberships to Cassel Hills Swimming Pool will go on sale Friday, April 1. Season passes can be purchased at the Vandalia Recreation

Cassel Hills is an outdoor swimming pool located at 1061 Taylorsview Drive.

Pool Manager Aaron Baker said changes in the pool's admission policy in 2023 will be carried over to 2024. The pool will be open

to the general public on Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, On Monday, Wednesday, and Sunday, the pool will be open only to season pass holders and Vandalia residents. Members and residents are permitted to bring three paid guests per family per visit.

Opening day for Cassel Hills Swimming Pool is Saturday, May 25. The final day of swim season will be Monday, September 2.



## **Tri-Cities Wastewater Treatment Plant** and Collection System Upgrades in Progress

Major plant and collection system improvement projects are in the early stages at the Tri-Cities Wastewater Treatment Authority (TCA). The plant is responsible for wastewater treatment for Vandalia, Tipp City, and Huber Heights. The \$125 million upgrades will address regulatory mandates.

## **Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrades**

There are two primary issues with the current facility.

The current plant has the capacity to handle no more than 11.2 million gallons of untreated wastewater per day. The upgrades will allow the plant to handle 17.7 million gallons per day.

Upgrades include the installation of an activated sludge filtration system, replacing an outdated two-stage trickling water filtration system that will not meet phosphorus and ammonia limits that go into effect in 2027.

**Collection System Equalization** In its current state, TCA sewer lines have difficulty handling the amount of water that is in the lines during



wet weather conditions. At times the lines are full, and the system discharges untreated wastewater. The Environmental Protection Agency has ordered TCA to correct this issue.

The project will see the installation of two equalization tanks in the Taylorsville MetroPark to eliminate sanitary sewer discharges at peak flow times. The tanks will allow the system to manage the extreme increases in water flow during wet weather events.

The project also calls for the installation of 8,300 feet of additional sewer lines to assist with the handling of extra water in the system during wet weather events.

- Run, Hide, Fight presentation, a presentation to our business partners which offers life-saving tips and strategies in the event of an active shooter situation;
- Home security survey, in which an officer surveys your home and

offers suggestions on how to make it more secure to stave off crime;

- Vacation house check, in which our officers will check on your home for anything unusual while you are out of town;
- Home camera registration, which alerts our officers to home cameras in your neighborhood that might be used to help solve a crime;
- The Endangered Missing Adult and Children (EMAC) program, in which residents can register vulnerable adults and children in the home so that our officers have critical information in the event they are missing;
- The **Explorer Program**, which is for anyone 14-20 years of age with an interest in police work. The program gives participants exposure to many different aspects of police work and has inspired many to pursue a career in law enforcement. Explorers meet every month, focusing on a different topic at each meeting.

## **Robinette Park Upgrades**

Crews began prep work in February on a new restroom facility planned for Robinette Park. The new restroom is one of many upgrades planned for the park over the next couple of years.

"The Parks and Recreation Master Plan adopted by City Council in early 2023 calls for investments in some of our aging parks," said Steve Clark, Parks and Recreation Director. "This restroom facility is something park visitors have been requesting for a number of years."

The facility should be completed by late summer.

"Plans are also underway to replace the playground structure at Robinette Park," Clark said. "We're still in the designing stages, but you can expect it to have robust inclusivity features similar to those which were incorporated into the playgrounds at Helke Park and the Sports Complex."

There are also plans to construct a splash pad at the park.

"The splash pad is a project that probably won't get underway until at least 2025," Clark said. "As a part of that project, we will also reconfigure the parking area to allow for more cars and a better traffic flow."

With the increasing popularity of pickleball, there are also plans to install pickleball courts at Robinette Park.

"We've seen an explosion in the popularity of pickleball over the past ten years," Clark said. "The outdoor courts at Helke Park are in high demand, and we believe a second outdoor option would be utilized often as well."

Funding for these projects will come from many sources.





"We are going to use some of the money we received from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to fund the restroom construction," Clark said. "We're also using grant money from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Community Development Block Grants, and the Montgomery

County Board of Developmental Disabilities."

"Vandalia is a top-tier suburb with top-tier services," Clark said. "It's important that we continue to invest in our parks to keep our amenities among the best in the region."



### Level 4: Clownfish & Level 5: & Seahorse

Children will work to improve their freestyle and backstroke in this class while learning all 4 competitive strokes. Emphasis will be placed on developing strokes that are swim meet legal. Skills include strong freestyle and backstroke, strong kicks (flutter, butterfly, breaststroke), novice breaststroke and butterfly, tread for 1 minute, standing dives, surface dives, flip turns. This annual event gives Vandalia and Butler Township residents the opportunity to offer up household treasures for sale using their garage and driveway as the retail showroom.





# PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT

The Department of Parks and Recreation is staffed by dedicated and highly trained public servants who provide residents with efficient, honest, and courteous service. The department is led by our tenured Director of Parks and Recreation, Steve Clark.

Vandalia Parks and Recreation Department strives to provide high-quality and accessible programs, services, parks, and facilities that inspire and enrich the lives of all Vandalia citizens. Through the dedication of our employees, a Council and management team that sets the standard for excellence, and our collaborative partnership with the community, the department has achieved much success.

The mission of the Vandalia Parks and Recreation Department is to enhance the lives of our citizens and community by providing quality and diverse facilities, programs and services.

The department is responsible for park maintenance and development, recreation and cultural programs, recreation center operations, senior center operations, golf course operations, aquatic center operations, as well as facility maintenance. The Parks and Recreation Department maintains more than 200 acres of park land and more than 100 acres of parking lots, buildings and street tree locations. Twenty-five (25) full-time employees and over 200 part-time and seasonal employees are responsible for the operation and maintenance of the Parks and Recreation Department with an \$8.3 million operating, maintenance, and capital budget.

# THE POSITION - THE IDEAL CANDIDATE - THE QUALIFICATIONS

## **General Description**

The City seeks a highly-motivated and ambitious individual to join our dynamic team in a management position with a clear path to advancement to Director within one year. The position plays an essential role in maintaining the health, safety and well-being of residents in Vandalia. The Recreation Superintendent will serve as a professional role model for the City as we strive to be a top-tier suburb that provides top-tier services.

The Recreation Superintendent and management trainee will undergo extensive training and development to gain a deep understanding of our operations, processes, and culture. The superintendent will work closely with various teams and departments to learn about our services, market dynamics, and strategic objectives. Through hands-on experience and mentorship from seasoned professionals, the superintendent will develop the skills and knowledge necessary to excel in a leadership role. The Recreation Superintendent requires an individual with strong leadership skills, as this position factors strongly in succession planning and will also be strongly considered for enhanced leadership positions within the department in the future. This position is aligned with a clear path to advancement to Director within one year.

Under administrative direction, the Recreation Superintendent directs, oversees, prioritizes and evaluates the overall operation of the Municipality's parks and recreation department for effective and cost-efficient service delivery. This position performs a variety of complex professional and administrative work in planning, developing, scheduling, directing and implementing a year-round, city-wide parks and recreation department, including management of city-owned facilities.

The Recreation Superintendent will explore best practices in the field, identify new trends and opportunities, engage relevant stake-holders, and make direct recommendations to ensure an appropriate balance of community programs, facilities and amenities now and into the future.

In 2023, Vandalia City Council adopted the <u>Parks and Recreation Master Plan</u>, which will inform decisions on the future direction of the City's impressive park system. The Recreation Superintendent will use the Master Plan as a road map when planning for community facilities, fitness programs and events.







# Wright Factory site, WPAFB project among \$44M in local projects funded in U.S. House vote

Federal spending bill moves 14 Miami Valley projects closer to completion.

The U.S. House voted Wednesday to appropriate over \$44 million that will go toward 14 projects in the Miami Valley.

"This funding bolsters our economy, strengthens our infrastructure, and increases the Miami Valley's competitiveness throughout our state," said Congressman Mike Turner, R-Dayton.

Wright-Patterson Air Force Base is the largest local benefactor with \$18 million designated to plan and design a 214,000-square-foot facility to "streamline organizations" that serve the Air Force Life Cycle Management Center, according to a press release from the congressman's office.

Turner and others have noted that the AFLCMC facilities at Wright-Patterson have been in poor shape and lack the ability to expand as the center grows. Turner told this news organization in December that current conditions are "not reflective of the great work that's being done by the people in acquisition."

The \$18 million in planning and design is one of the first steps to create an all-new headquarters that's expected to cost more than \$200 million.

The city of Dayton is set to receive \$8 million in total from the bill. Four million dollars will go toward restoring and renovating the historic Wright Brothers' Airplane Factory, which stands desolate after a devastating fire in spring 2023.

Dayton Mayor Jeffrey Mims Jr. commended Turner for his work to help "restore the historic Wright Company Factory as the city does our diligence to make this site an asset for the community."

"This is truly a transformative project for West Dayton and Congressman Turner's support remains critical," Mims said.



The rest of the bill's allocated projects and their price tags are as follows:

- \$3.5 million to Five Rivers MetroParks to improve park plumbing, electrical and lighting systems, as well as the construction of programming space
- \$3 million to St. Mary's Development Corporation to restore and renovate the Veterans Affairs History Center



- \$2 million to the University of Dayton for new equipment at its Microsystems Workforce and Research Center, which Turner said will allow the university to provide specialized training to accelerate the region's manufacturing output
- \$2 million to Sinclair Community College to expand its Unmanned Aerial Systems Training Initiative
- \$2 million to the Dayton Children's Foundation to construct a new three-story facility for outpatient mental services
- \$1.5 million to Beavercreek Twp. to improve the safety of the Valley Bell Connector that connects commuters from Greene County to Wright-Patterson Air Force Base
- \$1.5 million to improve Wright-Patterson Air Force Base's perimeter security fence in Riverside

- \$1.4 million to the Boys and Girls Club of Dayton to improve facilities and build community spaces in the city
- \$1 million to seal and decontaminate the American Carco site in Harrison Twp. after the manufacturing facility leaked chemicals into the ground
- \$750,000 to increase the capacity of the Tri-Cities Regional Wastewater Authority's wastewater management system
- \$200,000 to the Army Corps of Engineers to enhance flood protection infrastructure in Dayton and Miamisburg.

Turner is up for re-election this year. He's unopposed in the in the Republican primary on March 19, but will face the winner of a crowded Democratic primary this November. The Democratic candidates are David Esrati, Amy Cox, Joe Kuzniar and Tony Pombo.
