

Re: Information Update - Period Ending June 21, 2024

Overall Income tax receipts (\$9,603,053) are down YTD by .08% (\$7,918) over May 2023. Withholding tax is up 1.81% YTD (\$124,689); Individual tax is up 3.51% YTD (\$37,750); Business net profit tax is down 10.46% YTD (-\$170,357). Refunds issued YTD were \$213,518.12. Overall receipts, net of refunds, were up .09% as compared to May 2023, also net of refunds.

The amount of income tax revenue budgeted for 2024 is \$19,671,000 (\$1,639,250/month \* 5 months = \$8,196,250). The amount collected YTD is \$9,603,053. Therefore, the amount collected through May is 17.16% higher than the estimated amount based on the budget.

- 2. Kristen Carnes (Assistant Finance Director), and I attended a regularly scheduled council study session and meeting. I presented a proposal for a supplemental increase in 2024 budget appropriations (General Fund), and the May YTD financial report.
- 3. Finance continues to provide data to the compilation team and auditors from Plattenburg and Associates for the 2023 Annual Report and audit for NAWA, Tri-Cities, and the City of Vandalia.
- 4. Kristen Carnes, Natalie Montgomery (Payroll Specialist) and I attended a meeting with a few other employees involved in the interview process to discuss the results regarding filling the vacant position of Human Resources Manager.
- 5. I appreciated the opportunity to take one of the Recreation Superintendent candidates on a tour of the city and lunch prior to the second interview.
- 6. I participated in second-round interviews for the vacant position of Human Resources Manager.
- 7. Kristen Carnes and I attended a meeting to discuss the upcoming copier renewal lease.
- 8. I participated in a Zoom call with the city attorney and bond counsel to discuss the current TIF agreement with the school district.

**SUBJECT:** INFORMATION UPDATE – PERIOD ENDING JUNE 21, 2024

- 1. June 1-7<sup>th</sup> was National CPR and AED Awareness Week. CRRC Morrett taught multiple classes during this time. To name a few, the Vandalia Rec Center for summer camp counselors and Joseph Airport Toyota. CRRC Morrett has done a fantastic job increasing classes and the number people CPR/AED certified this year so far.
- Earlier this month during a routine outdoor tornado siren test, the Rec Center siren
  failed to activate. After identifying an issue, repairs, followed by additional testing, the
  Division of Fire can confirm all outdoor tornado sirens are operational.
- Training this reporting period for crews have been, but not limited to, rope and high angle rescue, pump operations and hose movement.
- 4. The Division of Fire, Firefighter of the Year, Chris Willoughby, Paramedic of the Year, Jacob Walters and Officer of the Year, Derek Copp were recognized at the June 3 annual Lions Club recognition dinner for "Top Tier" employees. Congrats to all Vandalia and Butler Township recipients.
- 5. On June 4<sup>th</sup> crews responded to a griddle fire at Airline Dairy Crème on Dixie Dr. Employees quickly evacuated the building and the Division of Police assisted with deployment of the suppression system. The business remained closed for the day for clean up.
- 6. Carrer Staff held a meeting on June 3<sup>rd</sup>. Items discussed were but not limited to; budget, staffing, hiring, and goals review.
- 7. Lt. Derek Copp recently completed an IAFF Peer Support Training program and was recognized as Vandalia's Hometown Hero at Dragons game. Derek was able to enjoy the game with his family and a few of his instructors.

- 8. On June 8<sup>th</sup> crews participated in a neighborhood beautification project. Crews were on hand to check and install smoke alarms. Additionally, crews were able to assist a homeowner with top tier service by installing a new string for his flagpole.

- 10. Crews responded on June 15<sup>th</sup> to Donora Dr, on the report of a house fire. Crews arrived to find a dryer fire that activated the smoke detectors. Residents made it outside with no injuries. Thank you to Huber Heights Fire and Butler Township Fire for assisting and providing mutual aid to our crews.
- 11. On June 16<sup>th</sup> crews responded to the Taylorsville Metro Park on a reported car fire.
  Crews quickly extinguished and there were no injuries reported.
- 12. A big thank you to the family whose son decided to share his birthday celebration with the crews at station 2 by delivering cupcakes. Thanks for thinking of the crew on such a special day!
- 13. Currently the area has been under a heat advisory. The Division of Fire has taken to social media multiple times to remind the community to be weather aware, to stay cool and to stay safe. The Division of Fire social media posts also has useful information on recognizing heat emergencies and when to call 911.
- 14. The Division of Fire is getting ready for Air Show weekend. This is always an exciting week for our community. The Division of Fire will provide EMS strike teams throughout the City for the Parade and in the city for the show through the weekend. The show is expected to be a hot one, crews are ready to serve and assist when needed.

#### **FACILITY MAINTENANCE DIVISION**

- Robinette Park restroom building soil work and concrete pad pour has been completed by Park Maintenance staff. We are working with Van Con to complete a final building inspection and approval so we can open the restrooms for park users. Staff will be installing the solar powered trash receptacles and charging station in the coming days.
- The City Facilities Signage and City Identification Signage Retrofit project continues with park sign installation. All park signs have been installed with brick installation to follow through the rest of this week and into next week. (Pictures at end of document). The contractor will then move to the construction and installation of new signage for the Municipal Building, Justice Center, Cemetery, Art Park and Helke Park.

#### **RECREATION / ATHLETICS DIVISION / SPECIAL EVENTS**

- A total of 8 businesses participated in the 35<sup>th</sup> Annual Vandalia Corporate Challenge, June 3-7. Adare Pharma Solutions, City of Vandalia, Superior Abrasives, Inteva Products, PSA Airlines, Kentner Sellers CPA's, GE Aviation, and Johnson Electric enjoyed a week of fun and exciting events. PSA Airlines captured the championship this year with Inteva Products finishing second and our very own City of Vandalia team finishing in third place. Kudos to Alicia McCracken on organizing another successful event.
- All Inclusive Recreation Day took place on June 14 at the Sports Complex. This impressive event attracted 132 participants who enjoyed many different recreation games and included lunch. Kudos to Recreation Coordinator Aaron Messenger for his coordination of this outstanding community event.
- Campfire Story Night was held on June 11 at Helke Park with 95 in attendance. Families enjoyed story time by the campfire with the Dayton Metro Library and made s'mores.
- As of June 17, we have sold 538 resident and 376 non-resident memberships to Cassel Hills Swimming Pool. The pool has been busy over the past week with temperatures in the 90's each day.

#### **RECREATION CENTER**


 Sharon Hamby has been working with Rich Hopkins to develop an updated Corporate Membership brochure for the VRC.  VRC daily admission receipts for the month of May totaled \$22,911, which is the highest monthly amount in the last 14 years.

#### **SENIOR CENTER**

- Membership numbers continue to grow at the Senior Center with 121 new members by the end
  of May, compared to 85 last year at this time. The current total membership of 676 members is
  about the same as the middle of October 2023 so we are running ahead of last year's pace.
- The Senior Center donates books to Project Read when the book selves at the facility become overloaded. The Librarian at the Senior Center, Judy Dils, along with several helpers recently boxed up books and Project Read picked them up on June 5. (Picture at end of document).

#### **GOLF DIVISION**

- The excessive heat has the same effect on rounds of golf at Cassel Hills as rain or chilly weather
  as play is significantly less during the recent hot and humid weather. Managing Golf
  Professional Ben Lickliter estimates the course will see a decrease in revenue of \$10k due to
  the extreme temperatures.
- We will be working with the bid award contractors for the Golf Course Irrigation project to establish timelines and discuss details of the project in the coming weeks.

- 1. During the past three-and-a-half weeks, VPD officers made 29 traffic stops on commercial motor vehicles for traffic violations. These stops resulted in 29 written warnings while working 28 additional enforcement hours.
- 2. Detectives charged a 53-year-old Trotwood man with felony theft by deception after he received money for contract work which he never completed.
- Detectives charged a 46-year-old Wapakoneta man with Hit/Skip Crash. The male suspect was issued a traffic citation for driving under suspension and leaving the scene of an accident.
- 4. Lt. Walker attended a course on June 5 hosted by the FBI National Academy Associates that covered considerations during an officer involved critical incident investigation. Specific topics included video evidence, Garrity Rights implications, and officer interviews.
- 5. Airshow Parade & Airshow planning: On June 7, 2024, Lt. Walker met with Airshow representatives to finalize VPD traffic control operations. Lt. Walker also met with Public Works on June 10 to discuss equipment needed for the parade and Airshow. Signs directing patrons will go up on Monday, June 17.
- 6. Detectives charged a 31-year-old Dayton man with two counts of Weapons under Disability (F3), Aggravated Menacing (M1), and Domestic Violence Threats (M4). The charges came from an incident where the male called and threatened to kill a Vandalia resident who is pregnant with his daughter. Patrol officers seen him arrive at the Vandalia residence and stopped him. The male was in possession of two handguns and had a prior conviction for drug possession, disabling him from possessing the firearms.
- 7. On June 10 and 13, I participated in the final interview of two candidates for the City's Human Resources Manager position. I was impressed by both candidates' experience and candor during their interviews and look forward to one being selected as Vandalia's next HR Manager.
- 8. On June 14, I met with Superintendent O'Leary, School Safety Director Bill Wertz, and Butler Twp. Police Chief Porter to discuss school safety measures for this upcoming school year.

- 9. On June 18, Sergeant Todd Flynn retired after 29 years with the Division of Police. On June 21, Detective Mike Hulbert retired after nearly 26 years with the Division of Police. We congratulate both officers for their dedication to the Division and service to Vandalia's residents. We wish them both the best in retirement.
- 10. On June 18, Officer Sommer spoke to the Vandalia Butler Optimist Club about his role as a Crime Prevention Officer.
- 11. The Division of Police is gearing up for a busy weekend beginning with coordinating traffic control and safety during the Chamber's Air Show Parade on Friday evening and the CenterPoint Energy Air Show on Saturday and Sunday. VPD employees will be working additional hours to staff many various positions throughout these events.
- 12. VPD's Third Annual Open House will occur on Thursday, June 27, at the Justice Center from 5:30-7:30 p. m. We will have patrol cars on display, police equipment display, TASER demonstration, body-cam video clips, MILO training simulator, tools used in forensic investigations, and free food. We invite members of the public to stop by and visit with your police officers and tour our police facility.
- 13. The Division of Police welcomes you to Vandalia and looks forward to working with you during the upcoming months.

## **Development & Engineering Services (DES)**

During this period on the Dog Leg Water and Sanitary Extension Phase 2, Outdoor Enterprise and Construction Inspector Games tested and put the watermain & 4 fire hydrants into service at the back of the National Rd parcels drastically improving firefighting capabilities in the area. Their directional drilling subcontractor has installed roughly 1,800 LF (linear feet) of 12 IN (inch) watermain and 1,800 LF of 6 IN sanitary force main; this directional drilling work allowed for traffic to be maintained at all times on Dog Leg Rd.

The design of the Tionda, Mossview, and Ranchview Dr Watermain Replacement & Resurfacing project was completed thanks to Engineering/GIS Technician Baughman. The City saved money by designing this project in-house. It was announced earlier this year that we were successful in receiving \$900,000 in grant funding (50% grant, 50% loan) through Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) for this project. The project is currently out for bid with a public bid opening scheduled for 7/9.

Garber Electric has installed all the City's EV charging stations and infrastructure, 100% funded by a rebate through AES. The project is currently waiting on AES service connections.

This week CG Construction came back to the I-75 / National Rd Sanitary Sewer Replacement project area, filled in the settled trench, and reseeded.

Staff have been working with a consultant (120Water) to assist with our lead & copper inventory to meet the October 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024 mandate by USEPA for all public water systems. We will be spreading more information on this over the City social media accounts as we will need residents' help to collect all the data USEPA is requiring by October.

We held our monthly department staff meeting on May 29th.

Public Works Superintendent Hayslett and I attended the monthly NAWA technical committee meeting on June 5<sup>th</sup> and TCA technical committee on June 12<sup>th</sup>.

## **Public Works (PW)**

Crews continued the catch basin (CB) repairs noted from crew inspections and hydro-excavated watermain valve boxes to realign/replace top sections before the 2024 Street Resurfacing project. Temporary asphalt was placed in front of the CBs and around the valve boxes.

Crews installed a new CB on Halcyon Ave that caused a sink hole at a resident's driveway approach and repaired a sewer line on Fitchland Dr.

In preparation for the Air Show, crews continued sweeping streets, right-of-way mowing, string trimmed guardrails, started spraying vegetation growth in the curb/gutters, and installed the Air Show banners.

Crews continued installing water meters across the City as part of the meter replacement multi-year project.

Crews hydro-excavated utility lines at specific locations for DES to improve the Tionda, Mossview, and Ranchview Dr Watermain Replacement & Resurfacing project plans.

Crews manned the monthly large item debris drop-off at the PW Garage and assisted with the Neighborhood Beautification Day on June 8<sup>th</sup> by hauling away volunteer-cut brush.

We performed 162 utility locates this period for Ohio 811.

Crews performed 4 burials at Poplar Hill cemetery during this period.

The mechanics kept busy servicing PW dump truck #24 brakes, A/C on PW trucks #11 & #16, mowers for the golf course, A/C on FD Engine #2, and siren on FD Medic #1.

The mechanics also gave the Fire Division preventative maintenance training on FD Engine #2.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> round interviews for the open full-time Public Works Office Manager position were completed and a conditional offer was accepted. The filling of this position is pending approval from the Civil Service Commission.

The listing has closed for full-time Public Works Technician. We are in the process of reviewing the applications and will plan 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> round interviews to build an eligibility list in an effort to keep our crew fully staffed moving forward.
