Mayor Herbst & City Councilmembers:

With the onset of cooler weather, school back in session, football season kicking off, outdoor pools closing, and Fall festivities happening, it signals that summer is winding down and Fall is right around the corner. The City continues to bustle with many activities and happenings as we move forward in service to our community.

ACM Rob Cron and I attended the 2025 Dayton Regional Impact Ohio Conference presented by JobsOhio and held at Wright State University on August 26<sup>th</sup> sponsored by the Ohio Chamber of Commerce, Dayton Area Chamber of Commerce, Dayton Development Coalition, and Impact Ohio. Several local, state, and federal elected officials spoke at the event on current issues, topics impacting families and the workforce, and their priorities moving forward. Many of the elected officials also spoke about the need for property tax reform across the state and the need for additional housing to continue to support the economic development efforts, especially in the Dayton region. The keynote speaker for the event was Gubernatorial Candidate Vivek Ramaswamy. Mr. Ramaswamy gave an inspiring speech about his goals and vision for the State of Ohio.



ACM Cron attended the Chamber's ribbon cutting for the Medicare Resource Center at 336 E. National Road. The Resource Center will provide free counseling services and educational classes to the public regarding Medicare issues. We welcome them to our community!

Cassel Hills Pool season has come to an end! This year, we had a total of 14,532 visits compared to 14,252 in 2024. A survey will be going out to CHP members to get feedback on the season. Overall, it was a great pool season despite rainy conditions early in the summer!

Ogelsby completed the concrete curb and sidewalk repairs for the Tionda, Mossview, and Ranchview (TMR) Watermain Replacement project. Butler Asphalt has completed the milling and paving of all project roadways. M&T Excavating is working on a punch list of items for closeout.



CG Construction has completed installing the new water main on Damian Street from Pool Avenue to W. Alkaline Springs Road, and on Romanus Drive from Damian Street to Soter Drive. CG has begun installing new water services residences near the right-of-way line on Damian Street.

Parks staff are putting in concrete pads at the Art Park in preparation for the new scultpures coming this Fall. They also replaced the grills at Helke Park, including a new concrete pad. This was a much needed upgrade and turned out great!



Passport to Safety is a long-time fun-filled, educational program in the city for incoming kindergarteners. Police and Fire representatives participated and coordinated the safety instruction to 44 students at St. Christopher School last week. Students learned about fire safety, water safety, stranger danger, school bus safety, safety around strange animals, as well as toured police and fire vehicles. Students participated in a Passport to Safety graduation on Friday, August 29th. This program will also be taught to kindergartners at Helke School during October.

Vandalia-Butler School District resumed classes on September 2<sup>nd</sup> to kick off the new school year. Road patrol officers, Chief Sucher, Captain Walker, and Captain Krimm made appearances at all school buildings in the City, including St. Christopher School where Captain Krimm accompanied students during their 8 am school mass due to the recent national tragedy in Minneapolis.

The Police Division's new Mobile Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) Responder, Trina Stewart, started her new position on August 26<sup>th</sup>. We share this position with Butler Township PD, and she spent her first week in orientation at BTPD. Trina's first day with VPD was September 2<sup>nd</sup> as she completed her orientation this week. We are excited to have this position filled and are thrilled to receive a grant through Ohio Criminal Justice Services for \$199,000 that covers this position for 2025-2026.

During the past one-and-a-half weeks, VPD officers made nine traffic stops on commercial motor vehicles for traffic violations. These stops resulted in two traffic citations and seven written warnings while working four additional enforcement hours.

The 2026 budget discussions with representatives from all City departments have begun and will continue throughout the next few weeks, as we continue the process and prepare for the upcoming council budget workshops.

Our Business Appreciation Day Golf Outing will be held next Tuesday, September 9<sup>th</sup> at Cassel Hills Golf Course. This annual event presents a great opportunity for staff to network with city businesses and learn about developments within their companies and organizations as well as thank them for being a part of our community.

Parks & Recreation staff are marketing the new hours for the VRC. Beginning October 1st, VRC hours will be year-round, Monday-Friday 5am-9pm. We believe these new hours allow us to welcome more members who enjoy an early morning workout before heading to their jobs and will likely increase membership. Weekend hours will remain the same. Patrons have been positive about the change!



I.T. staff will be meeting with department heads on September 16<sup>th</sup> to discuss Cybersecurity and Business Continuity Plans as they relate to House Bill 96 and design a formal Cybersecurity Plan for Council to adopt later this year.

You and I attended the Dayton Region Impact Ohio event held at Wright State University last week sponsored by the Ohio Chamber of Commerce and Dayton Development Coalition. Several local and statewide elected officials spoke at the event on current issues and what their priorities are moving forward. Many spoke about the need for property tax reform across the state and the need for housing to continue to support the economic development efforts, especially in the Dayton region. The keynote speaker for the event was Gubernatorial Candidate Vivek Ramaswamy. Mr. Ramaswamy gave an inspiring speech about his goals and visions for the State of Ohio.



- Much of this period has been spent working on the 2026 budget and reviewing budgets with the different departments. This year has been exciting and challenging as everyone learns our new budget software, ClearGov.
- Leann Hanf, you and I attended the Tri Cities Wastewater Authority board meeting last week. Updates were given on of the capital improvement projects, and we discussed the transition process for TCA taking over the day-to-day operations of the plant.
- We continue to meet bi-weekly with our architect, WDC Group, on the final design of the new Public Works Facility. Our goal is to have the final design completed, award bids and have a contract in place by year's end. We have asked for an updated cost estimate for the project as we begin to discuss our financing options.
- Ben Borton and I continue to meet bi-weekly with our consultant and the Montgomery County Engineer's office on the final design of the DIA Northeast Logistics roadway project. Right of Way negotiations have begun with certain property owners along the route where right of way acquisition is needed early for utility relocations.

- Ben Borton and I also participated in the monthly meeting with several jurisdictions regarding roadway improvement projects surrounding the Dayton International Airport.
- I attended the Ribbon Cutting for Medicare Resource Center at 336 E. National Road. The Resource Center will provide free counseling services and educational classes to the public regarding Medicare issues.



- Rich Hopkins is attending the 3CMA conference this week in Las Vegas. The 3CMA Conference is targeted at helping cities and counties communicate with their residents and business communities. Rich always comes back from the conference with great ideas and new trends to continue to provide great communication services to our community.
- We met with a prospective owner interested in the property at 7500 Poe Avenue, the former El Rancho Grande restaurant. They are interested in razing the current facility and constructing a new restaurant on that site. They are currently still in the planning stages.
- Staff had a meeting this week with an engineer for a potential Take 5 Oil Change facility at the recently rezoned property at 3320 Benchwood Road.
- Planning Commission will have one item on their agenda for the September 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting. The developer is requesting a rezoning for the last section of the Foxfire Subdivision from Residential Singel Family (RSF) 2 to Residential Singel Family (RSF) 4 and Agriculture (A).

#### **Development & Engineering Services (DES)**

<u>Dog Leg Water and Sanitary Extension Phase 2 project</u>: Capital Electric completed the installation of security lighting at the Dog Leg Rd and National Rd lift stations.

<u>Vandalia Bikeway Connector project</u>: Security Fence continued working on the intersection traffic signals and is now waiting on the new AES service for the S Brown School Rd/Cassel Creek Dr/Scholz Dr intersection. Security Fence plans to install the enclosed fence on the new bikeway bridge next week.

<u>Tionda, Mossview, Ranchview (TMR) Watermain Replacement project</u>: Ogelsby completed the concrete curb and sidewalk repairs. Butler Asphalt has completed the milling and paving of all project roadways. M&T Excavating is working on punch list items for closeout.

<u>Damian, Soter, Romanus, Desales (DSRD) Watermain Replacement project</u>: CG Construction has completed installing new water main on Damian St, from Pool Ave to W Alkaline Springs Rd, and on Romanus Dr from Damian St to Soter Dr. CG has begun installing new water services residences near the right-of-way line on Damian St.

<u>2025 Sanitary Sewer Lining project</u>: Insight Pipe Contracting's chemical grouting subcontractor, Lake County Sewer, has completed the grouting of service lateral connections to the sanitary main. This year's project is completed.

- AB Normal (7500 Poe Ave): the new owners met with staff and shared their preliminary plans for a new restaurant at the old El Rancho Grande site.

DES, Police, and Fire staff meet with the hotel operators for their annual hotel/motel license meeting. Inspections for their 2026 licenses are expected to be completed by end of October.

Chief Building Official Mastrino and Parks & Recreation Facilities Superintendent Wells met with a structural engineer and artist to discuss a potential new Art Park Arch.

PW Superintendent Hayslett and I attended the monthly technical committee meeting and Outfall Channel project review meeting for the plant's new outfall to the Great Miami River on September 3<sup>rd</sup>.

#### Tri-Cities North Regional Wastewater Authority (TCA) – wastewater treatment:

Council approved the sewer use ordinance at the 9/2 Council meeting, which TCA needed to clear some Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) Findings & Orders along with approved ordinance updates from Tipp City and Huber Heights.

#### Public Works (PW)

#### New Public Works Facility (810 Northwoods Blvd):

City staff met with WDC Group for our biweekly design status meeting on August 27<sup>th</sup> and Mansfield Energy on August 25<sup>th</sup> to discuss new fuel tanks/systems for the new facility.

Choice One Engineering has submitted the Conditional Letter of Map Revision (CLOMR) to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to allow us to install a large culvert over the stream just south of Northwoods Blvd (through the flood plain and floodway) for the new PW facility entrance.

#### Streets:

Crews fixed a bad section of asphalt near 248 Mountair Dr, brought to our attention by a resident. We appreciate our residents keeping an eye out and letting us know of any issues they see so our crews can address the issues faster.

#### Storm Sewer:

Crews started our catch basin (CB) cleaning program. Currently, crews are cleaning out CBs that we know have debris buildup using our hydro-excavating truck to vacuum out the debris allowing the CBs to function better during storm events.

Crews continued our street sweeping program.

#### Water:

Crews continued installing new water meters inside residences/businesses and outside in meter pits.

Crews are working to replace an old fire hydrant and guard valve hit by a vehicle at Scott Ave and S Perry St. This hydrant is currently leaking and leaning.

#### Other Services:

Crews laid 318 tons of asphalt for the golf course cart paths.

Crews installed American flags for Labor Day and replaced VB Aviators banners with Vandalia Oktoberfest banners in preparation for the event this weekend.

Crews performed 41 utility locates this period for Ohio 811.

Crews went through work zone training through Miami Valley Risk Management Association (MVRMA) hosted at the Justice Center training room on September 3<sup>rd</sup>.

#### Vehicle Maintenance:

The mechanics ordered parts for the trackless machine's flail mower attachment (used for ROW trimming of brush) and requested more quotes for truck lifts for the new PW facility.

The mechanics also repaired the wiring on Fire Division's Engine #2 and fixed the door latch on Medic #3.

- 1. The installation of the Mitel phone system is still in progress. The vendor has completed most of the required configuration; however, our IT staff must still carry out a significant amount of programming for each individual phone. One of the major dependencies, the integration of the dispatch phone system with the new Mitel equipment, will not be finalized for another month or so. This delay will extend the overall project timeline. In the meantime, our team will continue working closely with each department to configure the new phones properly and ensure staff receive the necessary training.
- 2. I have been working with DES on the design of the new Public Works facility, which involves the network design for computers, wireless, cameras, access control, phones, internet, etc.
- 3. IT will be meeting with department heads on September 16 to discuss Cybersecurity and Business Continuity Plans as they relate to House Bill 96, then design a formal Cybersecurity Plan for council to adopt later this year.
- 4. I met with Finance and the City Manager's Office to review the 2026 IT Budget, utilizing ClearGov to track projected expenses for the upcoming year. The software proved to be intuitive and efficient, and I look forward to continuing to use it as part of our budget management process moving forward.
