Welcome to Summer CampREC at the Vandalia Recreation Center!

Important Information:

Camp Hours: Camp runs 9:00am – 4:00pm with structured activities during that time. FREE extended hours are available from 7:30am – 9:00am and 4:00pm – 5:30pm.

Late Pick-up Policy for CampREC:

A flat fee of \$10.00 will be assessed to those individuals dropping off before 7:15am or picking up after 5:45pm. A flat fee of \$20.00 will be assessed to those individuals dropping off their child before 7:00am or picking up after 6:00pm. If this happens twice in the camp season, the child will not be permitted back at camp for the remainder of the year. If you know you are going to be late, please contact Aaron or Sydney. If they do not respond, please contact the Vandalia Recreation Center Front Desk at (937) 415-2340.

The Late Pick-up fee must be paid immediately at the Front Desk of the Vandalia Recreation Center for any fees incurred due to late pick up. If payment is not made, the child will not be permitted to attend camp and no refunds will be issued.

Things to bring daily to camp (please have your child's name on all their belongings):

- Water bottle
- Bathing suit
- Towel
- Sunscreen/Bug Spray
- Closed-Toe athletic shoes
- Lunch and drink (Lunches will be refrigerated but no microwave is available)
- Backpack or gym bag (to keep belongings in)
- Change of clothes (We make every effort to notify parents if we plan on campers getting wet or dirty, but sometimes the fun is spontaneous!).

Things NOT to bring to camp:

- Cell phone, any type of electronics, or toys
- Chewing gum
- Food that must be heated
- Smart watches that connect to WiFi that can send messages, pictures, etc.

Use of Phone/Smart Watches:

Due to the nature of the disruption, children will not be permitted to use a cell phone. Parents will be contacted by our camp staff in an emergency, illness, or for behavioral reasons. Children can not bring smart watches to camp as well. If your child brings a cell phone or smart watch to camp, counselors will have to hold on to them for the whole camp day.

Camp T-Shirts:

One t-shirt is provided to each camper registered for a week of camp or registered for a Wednesday. Additional t-shirts can be purchased for \$10.00 each (depending on how many leftovers we have). Campers that do not dress in their t-shirt on field trip days will be required to purchase an additional shirt to attend the field trip.

Sunscreen & Insect Repellant:

Should you wish for the camp staff to apply sunscreen or insect repellant to your child, you must complete the Sunscreen & Insect Repellant portion of the Acknowledgement form. Otherwise, each child will be responsible for applying their own sunscreen and insect repellant. Each child must bring their own sunscreen and insect repellant. Camp will not supply these items. Please have your child keep their sunscreen and insect repellant in their backpacks with their names clearly marked on all items.

Camp Activities:

- Weekly calendars will be handed out to parents regarding activities and field trips. Calendars can be found in the Camp Room or at the Vandalia Recreation Center Front Desk
 - Scheduled activities are subject to change.
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Participation:

The camp staff has planned an exciting schedule of activities for the summer. All campers are required to be at group activities and stay with camp staff. Children may choose not to participate in planned group activities, but no additional activities will be planned for those children who choose not to participate, and they will not be able to make incentive for the week. Please encourage your child to try something new or reacquaint themselves with familiar games and activities.

Swim Test:

All campers are permitted to swim in the shallow end of the pool. If campers would like to enter the deep-end pool, they must pass a swim test administered by the camp staff:

- Campers only need to take and pass the swim test once during the whole summer but must pass it each year.
 - If the camper does not pass the swim test, they may re-take the test the following week they are at camp, for as many weeks as they want until they pass.
 - Campers who do not pass the swim test (or choose not to take it) must remain in the shallow end of the pool.
 - A log of campers who have taken and passed or failed the swim test will be kept with the camp staff and updated each week.
 - Lifejackets are available for children to use.
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ABC Log:

The ABC log is our parent/guardian notification system that allows for camp staff to effectively communicate events that occur throughout the day. **A**ccidents, **B**ehaviors, and **C**omments/**C**ompliments are logged throughout the day by counselors and must be read and initialed by the parent/guardian during sign-out.

We try to communicate more than just negative incidents or behavior issues. Our counselors try to recognize camper achievements and strive to communicate those just as frequently.

Cassel Hills Pool:

If weather permits, camp will travel to Cassel Hills Pool every Monday. The \$2.00 admission fee is included.

Lost & Found

CampREC will have their own Lost & Found basket in the Camp Room. The Lost & Found will be emptied into our main Lost & Found at the Vandalia Recreation Center every Friday, so please make sure your child has all their belongings when they leave camp each day. CampREC is not responsible for holding on to your child's possessions, but we will always help your child find their belongings if need be.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

These rules and regulations are necessary so that we may enhance the enjoyment and safety of all participants.

1. To attend CampREC, children must be 6 – 12 years old.
 - Children must be 6 before Tuesday, May 31 and cannot turn 13 before Friday, August 12.
2. Children must:
 - a. Use appropriate behavior and language always and use materials and supplies in a safe and respectable manner.
 - b. Respect and follow the directions of camp staff.
 - c. Respect the Vandalia Recreation Center property and the property of others.
3. There is absolutely no fighting or disruptive behavior. Please be sure to read the Camp Code of Conduct and the discipline procedure to your child so they are aware of the consequences.
4. All camp participants must stay within the designated boundaries of the camp as outlined by camp personnel.
5. The camp staff will not be responsible for the loss, damage or theft of personal items. Personal belongings should be labeled with child's name. Please leave all valuable personal belongings (including jewelry) at home. Children are not permitted to bring toys, electronics, etc. We **strongly** encourage children to use locks when using the locker rooms.
6. Campers **MUST** wear tie-on shoes (sneakers preferred). **NO OPEN TOE SHOES, FLIP-FLOPS OR SANDALS.**
7. All camp forms must be signed by a parent or guardian and returned to the camp staff prior to your child's first day of camp.
8. If your child needs any medication during camp hours, please include it on their emergency form (Please include detail information including dose and time medication should be administered). If your child is taking prescription medication, the Vandalia Recreation Center requires a doctor's note for administration of the medicine. All medication must be kept in their original containers. Our staff is not permitted to administer any non-prescription medication without **written** permission from the parent.

BEHAVIOR MANAGEMENT

Our staff, while discouraging inappropriate behaviors, focuses on providing positive reinforcement for acceptable behavior, and encourages learning as a natural part of growth and development. We want each camper to have a positive experience at camp, and to experience as much of the camp session as possible.

We use a color chart to promote good behavior and for children to work toward receiving an incentive at the end of each week. Children start out on yellow each week and move to green by displaying good behavior. All children ending the week on green will participate in the end of the week incentive.

How to get on Green for the week:

- Participate in all camp activities
- Follow all the rules on the Camp Code of Conduct
- Have a positive attitude each day at camp

Accordingly, the following actions will be taken when addressing behavior that is unacceptable in a camp environment and their color will be moved by following the system below. Camp staff has the discretion to skip colors and move straight to purple or red based on the severity of the offense.

1. **Reminder/Correction.** "Please ask before...." **(R)**
2. **Verbal Warning.** Counselors will be sure the camper understands why they are receiving a warning. Parents may be notified via the ABC log. **(Yellow)**
3. **Meeting with the Camp Supervisor.** Camp Supervisor will talk to the child about their behavior. Parents are notified via the ABC log. **(Orange)**
4. **Meeting with the Camp Supervisor and Programs Manager.** Incident is documented, and parents are notified via phone or email. **A Behavior Contract will be made. (Purple)**
5. **Camper is sent home for the remainder of the day.** Parents will be notified and required to pick up their child immediately. **(Red)**
Note: Depending on the severity of the behavior, a camper could be sent home longer than the rest of the day
6. **Camper is sent home for the remainder of the week.** If a camper returns to camp, and the problem persists, they will be sent home for the rest of the week with no refund. **(Red)**
Note: Depending on the severity of the behavior, a camper could be removed for the remainder of the season.
7. If a child is sent home for the week **twice** during the camp season, they will be removed from camp for the remainder of the season with **no refund.**

If your child receives a **Red** card, you will lose your camp monies for the length of the suspension. E.x. If your child gets suspended for a week, you will lose that weeks' payment.

*Camp Staff has the discretion to suspend/expel participant depending on the severity of the offense at any level.

CampREC Payment Process

Looking for convenience? Have your weekly/daily payments and field trip fees posted to the credit card of your choice. (See Authorization Agreement for more information).



All camp payments **MUST BE PAID IN ADVANCE**.

The \$25 deposits are non-refundable.

Registration and payments can be made on a weekly or daily basis.

Weekly Enrollment:

If you are paying the weekly rate the child will be registered for a full week of camp.

The discount for the 2nd, 3rd and 4th+ child applies to children living in the same household and enrolled in the same week.

When registering your child for camp, you are required to pay a deposit of \$25 per child per week to hold your child's weekly spot for camp. This deposit fee will be subtracted from your total weekly payment fee for camp and is non-refundable. **Please note:** You will **not** be able to change from a weekly enrollment to a daily enrollment.

Remaining Amount Owed Weekly: (includes weekly field trip fee.)

Payment in full is due by **6:30pm on the Friday 10 days prior to each week** the child is enrolled. If you fail to pay your balance in full, your child will be un-enrolled from the corresponding week of camp and you will lose your \$25 participant fee deposit.

If your child is unable to attend any week of camp for which they are enrolled, you must contact the Recreation Programs Manager at amessenger@vandaliaohio.org **in writing** 10 days prior to the week enrolled. If this is completed, you will not be held responsible for the week's remaining balance, but the \$25 deposit will be forfeited – this will be permitted only **TWICE** per child during the camp season. If you do not give a 10 day notice in writing, you will be responsible for the week's payment regardless of attendance.

You will **not** be able to transfer missed days to other weeks of camp or get refunded on certain days that you missed during a weekly enrollment that were not related to illness or non-life altering situations. Any past due balances from missed camp payments must be made prior to your child attending another week of camp. If you are registering your child less than 10 days in advance, you will be required to pay the full amount at the time of registration.

DAILY ENROLLMENT:

Daily Enrollment will be available for field trip days only.

All daily enrollments must pay the entire amount at the time of registration.

If you drop your child off on a day for which they are not registered and there is an opening in camp, you will be required to pay for that day before leaving the building and show proof of payment to the Camp Leaders. Your child will not be allowed to stay at camp until the balance has been paid.

Sick Child:

If your child is ill the day of camp and is unable to attend, you must notify the Recreation Programs Manager at 937-415-2334 or amessenger@vandaliaohio.org by 9:00am. If you receive the Recreation Program Manager's voicemail, please leave a message. Each child is permitted 2 transfers per camp season, provided there is an opening for the requested transfer day. After the 2 transfers, you will be held responsible for payment and no refunds will be issued unless written documentation of a life altering situation is submitted to and approved by the Programs Manager.

Field Trips

Camp takes a weekly field trip to various places every Wednesday. Any child signed up for a field trip day must attend the field trip. There will be no supervision at the VRC while the camp is on the field trip. All field trip fees are included in the weekly fee.

Camp Code of Conduct

While at camp, there are rules that campers must follow so that camp can run as smoothly as possible.

1. No talking while a counselor is talking

When a counselor is talking, giving directions, etc. with the group of kids, no campers should be talking during this time and should not talk until the counselor is done saying what they need to say.

2. Keep your hands and feet to yourself

Campers are encouraged to play with each other, but campers should not be putting their hands or feet on other campers that could cause someone to get hurt.

3. Treat others the way THEY want to be treated

The golden rule! Everyone wants to be treated nicely and respected. Campers should not verbally or physically hurt other campers while they are at camp.

4. Pick up after yourself

Counselors are not custodians for campers! Campers should always pick up their trash and throw it away after lunch, snacks, crafts, games and activities.

5. No bullying

As counselors, we care about the safety and wellbeing of your child. If there are any instances of bullying happening, we want your child to immediately let camp staff know so we can take care of the situation as fast as possible. Bullying will not be tolerated and can cause your child to be removed from summer camp.

6. **Always stay with counselors and the group**

Campers should never wander off from the group and should always let a counselor know where they are going.

7. **Use appropriate language**

Campers should never use curse words or talk inappropriately while at camp.

8. **Be responsible for your belongings**

Campers should always pick up their belongings and make sure they know where they put their belongings at camp.

9. **Respect camp materials**

Campers should not damage the camp materials we have which include but not limited to: arts & crafts materials, game boards, toys, etc.

10. **HAVE FUN!**

We want you to have a blast while you are here at summer camp. To maximize the most fun you can have, you must follow all these rules.

SIGN IN/OUT POLICY

- To ensure the safety of your child, we require you to sign in/out your child everyday they attend camp. Children **will not** be permitted to sign themselves in/out of camp. If a child is not signed in, they will not be able to participate in camp activities and will have to sit in the Recreation Programs Manager's office until a parent/guardian comes back in to sign the child in.
- If a different parent or guardian will be picking up the child, the camp staff must be notified during the time they are being signed in for camp and the adult must be on the child's pick-up list (below). When the individual arrives to pick up the child, they may be asked to provide a picture ID for identification.
- For most of the day, the sign in/out procedure will take place in the Camp Room. If the camp is not in the room, a note will be placed on the Camp Room door indicating the location of the camp. Please drop off any of the child's belongings in the conference room and bring your child to the corresponding area of the center.
- If the camp is located elsewhere in the Vandalia Recreation Center, please notify the Front Desk you are dropping your child off for the camp and they will let you enter the facility.

Participant Agreement, Release & Acknowledgment of Risk

In consideration of the services of the Vandalia Parks and Recreation Department (VPRD), their agents, owners, officers, volunteers, participants, employees, and all other persons or entities acting in any capacity on their behalf, I hereby agree to release and discharge the VPRD, on behalf of myself, my children, my parents, my heirs, assigns, personal representatives and estate AS FOLLOWS:

CLIMBERS agree to 1-6

1. I acknowledge that rock climbing on an artificial climbing wall entails known and unanticipated risks which could result in physical or emotional injury, paralysis, death, or damage to myself, to property or third parties. I understand that such risks simply cannot be eliminated without jeopardizing the essential qualities of the activity. Such risks include, among other things: falling off the wall or rock, loose and/or damaged artificial holds or loose rock; rented equipment failure, falling to the ground, on other users, or being fallen on by other users; abrasions from the wall or rock, ropes, pads, or the floor/ground; equipment failure; belay and/or belayer failure; climbing out of control or beyond one's personal limits, the negligence of other climbers, visitors, participants, or other persons who may be present; musculoskeletal injuries and/or over training; head injuries; or my own negligence.
2. I expressly agree and promise to accept and assume all of the risks existing in this activity. My participation in this activity is purely voluntary, and I elect to participate in spite of the risks.
3. I hereby voluntarily release, forever discharge, and agree to indemnify and hold harmless the VPRD from any and all claims, demands, or causes of action, which are in any way connected with my participation in this activity or my use of the VPRD's equipment or facilities, including any such claims which allege negligent acts or omissions of the VPRD.
4. Should the VPRD or anyone acting on their behalf, be required to incur attorney's fees and costs to enforce this agreement, I agree to indemnify and hold them harmless for all such fees and costs.
5. I certify that I have adequate insurance to cover any injury or damage I may cause or suffer while participating, or I agree to bear the costs of such injury or damage myself. I further certify that I have no medical or physical conditions which could interfere with my safety in this activity, or I am willing to assume – and bear the costs of – all risks that may be created, directly or indirectly, by any such condition.
6. In the event that I file a lawsuit against VPRD, I agree to do so solely in the state of Ohio, and I further agree that the substantive law of that state shall apply in that action without regard to the conflict of law rules of that state. I agree that if any portion of this agreement is found to be void or unenforceable, the remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect. **By signing this document**, I acknowledge that if anyone is hurt or property is damaged during my participation in this activity, I may be found by a court of law to have waived my right to maintain a lawsuit against the VPRD on the basis of any claim from which I have released them herein. I have had sufficient opportunity to read this entire document. I have read and understand it and agree to be bound by its terms.
