- 5. City Planner Recruitment: Our team is conducting a first round of panel interviews this week.
- 6. Commercial Truck Traffic: I have several upcoming meetings with City Manager Applegate of Union, Director Stanley of the Montgomery County Transportation Improvement District, partners at the Ohio Department of Transportation, the Dayton Development Coalition, and the City's lobbyist. It is clear that partners throughout the region are gaining an understanding and appreciation for the negative effects of commercial carrier traffic in Vandalia. Our team will continue to consider multidisciplinary efforts in pursuit preserving and enhancing the livability of our community.
- 7. Email Phishing and Network Security Threats: IT Manager Darren Davey has advised that all staff be on high alert with regard to suspicious emails. The City has received a swell of emails whereby the sender masquerades as an employee in an effort to get the recipient to click a link, download a file, or possibly send money. Look for key signs including:
 - a. Incorrect email addresses;
 - b. Odd phrases that would not be normally used by a native English speaker; and
 - c. Emails that appear to be an image rather than text.

If you suspect that an email may be malicious, please notify the IT Division for assistance. In all cases, it is better to be prudent than to potentially expose the City's network.

- **8. Blood Drive:** The City is hosting a blood drive in the Justice Center on June 18. The region is currently experiencing a shortage and now is a great time to sign up! There are currently 24 spaces left. Visit: www.donortime.com.
