
Honorable Mayor Herbst & Esteemed City Councilmembers:




Infrastructure Project: Energy Systems Group is working with contractors to finish the Recreation Center Roof and HVAC project with a tentative date of June 5 for the reopening of Aquatic Center. This date will be confirmed at the weekly progress meeting on Thursday, May 25.

VRC Active Shooter Training: Facility Manager Alicia McCracken worked with Crime Prevention Officer Andy Wehner to establish a Run, Hide and Fight Active Shooter Training for the staff of the Recreation Center, scheduled for June 29.

Cassel Hills Golf Course Revenues: The golf course has been very busy over the last week thanks in part to the wonderful weather we have

been experiencing. On Sunday, May 21 staff collected over \$8,000 in greens and cart fees.





Blood Drive: VPD will host a blood drive on June 16.

Commercial Truck Traffic: During the past week, VPD officers made 10 traffic stops on commercial motor vehicles for traffic violations. These stops resulted in one traffic citation, nine written warnings and zero verbal warnings while working eight additional enforcement hours.

This week, commercial truck traffic enforcement was a common topic during the Police Sergeant interview process. This will

This week, the City's contractor performed simultaneous video traffic/truck counts along National Road at the intersections of Airport Access Road, Peters Pike and Dixie Drive. The counts run from 7am – 7pm on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. This is a standard measurement that is used by individuals within



the profession to ensure comparability across locations – unless there is some other underlying circumstance that makes the location unique. We will be comparing these numbers with previous counts and be ready to present this information to City Council at the June 19 meeting.

Senator Huffman has indicated that he will be working with the Legislative Service Commission to assist us in developing a proposal for a no thru truck prohibition on US-40.

VPD New Chaplain Hayward Chappell: On May 23, we officially welcomed our newest department chaplain, Hayward Chappell. Hayward is a pastor with Christian Family Fellowship Ministry in Tipp City. He is a Vandalia resident and wanted to serve in the community in which he resides. He joins Pastors Bob Hussong and Mark Batton as the third VPD Chaplain.

Tri-Cities Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements: Tri-Cities is working on plant improvements totaling an estimated \$81.5 million and collection system improvements totaling approximately \$19.5 million. This is an immense project that will be managed between the Tri-Cities General Manager, Danny Knife, and the three city managers. The plant has been largely untouched since 1985. The Tri-Cities team began investigating plant upgrades in 1999. There are regulatory mandates relating to phosphorus and ammonia limits; as well as flow capacity issues in both the plant and collection system that make these projects necessary. Vandalia is likely to be responsible for \$25.9% of the cost based on current flows. The debt service for these costs has been factored into the utility rates. Tri-Cities is a standalone joint venture government under the Ohio Revised Code with its own bond rating and debt capabilities. It is likely that


these projects will be financed through a combination of grants, forgivable loans, zero interest loans, and 30-year bond financing. These obligations will be paid through enterprise funds (wastewater fees paid by customers), which is separate from the City of Vandalia's ability to secure general obligation debt (paid back by income tax dollars). The timeline for the plant improvement is as follows:

- 2 years of engineering;
- 1 year for preliminary design;
- 1-year for final design; and
- 3-4 years for construction.



Preliminary engineering for the plant improvements will cost \$1.5 mm and final design engineering will cost \$6 mm. This week, Congressman Turner's office indicated that he plans to advance our request for federal community project funding. Our team's goal for the plant improvements is to submit a construction loan nomination by Aug 31, 2025.

Cured in Place Pipe (CIPP) Lining Project: The CIPP project on the Tri-Cities interceptor line is well underway (pictured) through Taylorsville Metro Park. This project is being funded by a \$2.4 million grant that Governor DeWine presented to Tri-Cities.





Public Works Week: This week we celebrated National Public Works Week. We are very blessed to have a tremendous group of individuals in our Public Works Department that do a great job of keeping our City running and providing top-tier service to our residents. Much of this work is done behind the scenes and is part of what makes our city great.



Development & Engineering Services

Double Jay Construction has the existing roadway excavated and gravel base is being installed. Their concrete sub-contractor was delayed a couple days but did begin pouring curb this week. They will complete the curb work next Tuesday and Wednesday. This will be followed up by installing the driveway approaches. They have done a good job of keeping access to the residents as much as they can.





Finfrock Construction is moving along very well with this year's curb & sidewalk replacement program. They have completed the concrete work on Inverness Avenue and Bartles Court. They are now pouring concrete on North American Boulevard. They have also begun excavation work on Hartshorn Drive and Bristol Drive.



Outdoor Enterprise has begun on the installation of the watermain along Dog Leg Road. They intend to install the majority of this and the remaining sanitary sewer force main by directional drilling the lines. This will significantly reduce the amount of traffic interruption and roadway repairs that would have been required if the trenches were excavated. This also eliminates sign relocation, tree replacement, and parking lot restoration for the church at 8986 Dog Leg Rd.

We performed traffic/truck counts this week along National Road at the intersections of Airport Access Road, Peters Pike and Dixie Drive. We will be comparing these numbers with previous counts and be ready to present this information to City Council at their June Meeting.

Site work continues on the new Ernst Corporate Headquarters facility at 993 Falls Creek Drive.

Final inspections continue at the Redwood Development on Park Center Drive. Multiple building have either already received or are nearing receipt occupancy certificates.

We have completed the installation of the Veterans Banners on Dixie Drive and put up the American Flags on National Road in observance of Memorial Day.

We have spent time this week on mowing and trimming various areas including around our guardrails.

<u>Member and Resident Only Days</u> - Every Sunday, Monday and Wednesday, pool admission will be limited to CHP Members and Vandalia Residents, each of whom may bring up to three non-resident paying guests.

Non-residents who purchase a membership will be admitted on Member/Resident Only days.

<u>General Admission Days</u> - Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday will be General Admission Days. Any person paying the daily admission fee will be admitted until maximum capacity is reached.

On General Admission days, CHP members and residents will be admitted beginning at 11:30 am. Non-residents will be admitted at 12:30 pm.
