Your brave and heroic actions ultimately resulted in saving a man's life during an apartment fire while putting yourself in harm's way and risking your own life. The details of the event were documented through your incident report, body-camera footage and eyewitness accounts.

On May 13, 2023, you and Officer Clymer responded to 111 Imperial Court on a structure fire at an apartment building. You arrived on scene first and confirmed there was an active fire in Apartment #1. Without hesitating, you made entry into the apartment, which was filled with smoke, and discovered an oxygen tank on fire. You located a 62-year old unresponsive male resident seated in a chair in the living room. You removed the male from his recliner and began pulling him away from the nearby fire and out the door of the apartment. Officer Clymer arrived on scene and assisted you with pulling the male resident out of the apartment and away from the fire to safety.

After removing the resident from the fire, you and Officer Clymer ran back inside the building and began alerting other residents and searching other apartments for anyone else remaining in the building. You forced entry into two apartments to search them and make sure that everyone was out of the building that was on fire.

You demonstrated bravery and courage putting your own life at risk by running into an apartment fire, pulling a resident out to safety and returning to the building to evacuate anyone else still inside the building. You took immediate action in a life-threatening situation and your bravery and exceptional service ultimately saved the life of a Vandalia resident who was inside the burning apartment.

To qualify for the Medal of Valor, while in a stressful situation, you took exceptional action at great personal risk by entering an apartment engulfed in flames to rescue the male resident who was incapacitated in apartment #1. You faced heavy smoke which limited your breathing and vision, yet you pulled the resident outside to safety where responding EMS units began providing medical care. You re-entered the

apartment building multiple times, faced with heavy smoke, to search for and clear the building of anyone else still inside. Several times during your search and evacuation, you were forced to step outside coughing to clear your lungs and returned to continue your search for anyone else. You put your life at risk due to several additional compressed oxygen tanks being in apartment #1 and presented a risk of explosion due to their proximity to the active fire. You also notified the responding fire and EMS units of the additional oxygen tanks for their safety when extinguishing the fire.

A panel of a senior police lieutenant, police sergeant, police officer, and public safety specialist reviewed this incident and the facts surrounding the case and unanimously concluded that your actions met the criteria for receiving the Vandalia Division of Police Medal of Valor. I concur with their recommendation and recommend you receive VPD's Medal of Valor for your exceptional bravery and courage on this call.

You and your family are invited to attend the August 21, 2023, City Council meeting where you will be recognized for your exceptional service and be awarded your Medal of Valor.

Great work to the Development and Engineering Services team on seeing this through with perfect timing.

**Backyard Barbeque:** Congrats to the Parks and Recreation Department on a great Backyard Barbeque event last night! It was a great time, and the Air Force Band of Flight was a real crowd pleaser.

Charlie always enjoyed returning to VPD to see how the department and staff were doing and enjoyed fishing with his late wife, Ann, who also worked at VPD as a public safety specialist. Communications Manager Rich Hopkins, Assistant City Manager Amber Holloway, and our Parks & Recreation team have worked hard to produce a publication that is representative of the high











quality of life we enjoy as residents of Vandalia.

**Downtown Market Study:** Place Dynamics will be in town next week conducting stakeholder meetings with business owners, regional development professionals, and elected officials. We are very fortunate to have many business owners who are volunteering their time to participate in and to inform this very important analysis.

**Electric Aggregation:** Vandalia residents who are on the AES standard rate (i.e., not in another third-party aggregation program) will receive a letter from Energy Harbor explaining the process to OPT-OUT of the program. Those taking no action will automatically be enrolled with Energy Harbor at the 6.57 cents per kWh through December 2025. A postcard will also follow from AES in the coming weeks to confirm that the switch to Energy Harbor.

Those Vandalia residents who are currently under contract with another third-party electric supplier, will have to contact Energy Harbor to <a href="OPT-IN">OPT-IN</a> to the program. It's highly recommended that residents check with your current supplier to confirm there are no early termination fees before switching to Energy Harbor. This can be done at: <a href="https://energyharbor.com/en/community-programs/find-your-program/vandalia-montgomery-dpl">https://energyharbor.com/en/community-programs/find-your-program/vandalia-montgomery-dpl</a>. The effective date of the new Energy Harbor contract is anticipated to be September 1, 2023. The 6.57 cents/kWh rate is fixed through December 2025. Residents can opt-out or opt-in of the Energy Harbor program at any time with no additional fees from Energy Harbor; however, fees may apply from residents' current third-party supplier. AES will remain our electric distributor and residents should contact AES for any service requests or power outages. Bills will still be paid to AES. I have enclosed a sample opt-out letter.

**Vandalia Bikeway Connector:** I have enclosed a letter to addresses along South Brown School Rd. This provides information regarding the Vandalia Bikeway Connector.

**Employee Appreciation Event:** Thank you to Human Resources Assistant Sherri Howard, Parks & Recreation, and the City Manager's Office staff for putting on a great employee appreciation event in Helke Park yesterday! It was great to see everyone. The next Employee Appreciation event will be held Wednesday, August 16 at the Sports Complex and we will invite our retirees.

**AED Donation to VBCSD:** Recently the Division of Fire purchased new Cardiac Monitors as part of a capital project. As a result, there were AED's (Automatic External Defibrillators) that are no longer in use by the Division of Fire. All surplus AED's were donated to the Vandalia Butler Schools to better equip their buildings with this important lifesaving device. This highlights the Fire Division's commitment to critical thinking, preparation to achieve the best emergency medical responses possible, and great fiscal stewardship.

**New Playgrounds:** Sitework is underway for the new Helke Park playground unit (the horseshoe pits and shuffleboard courts will be removed, making the playground easily accessible from both shelters). Staff removed fencing and light pole bases in this area in anticipation of the arrival of the playground installation contractor this week. Once onsite, the installer is estimated to take two weeks to complete the installation. They will then move to the Sports Complex to complete the demolition of the current playground unit on the baseball side of the complex, followed by installation of the new unit.

**Facilities Infrastructure Project**: Light poles are being installed along the east pathway at the Sports Complex. The contractor has installed a total of 12 poles and will continue to install a total of 32 poles in the coming week. The installed pole lights (solar/LED) are in operation. I have enclosed a map and letter that was sent to neighboring residents.

**Commercial Vehicle Enforcement:** During the past three weeks, VPD officers made 18 traffic stops on commercial motor vehicles for traffic violations. These stops resulted in five traffic citations, 12 written warnings and one verbal warning while working 16 additional enforcement hours.

**School Safety:** Chief Althouse recently attended a monthly meeting with VBCSD Superintendent O'Leary, Safety Director Bill Wertz and Butler Twp. Police Chief John Porter to discuss school safety and community concerns for the safety of our students and school staff.

**CALEA Assessment:** VPD's Commission on the Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) on-site assessment will occur July 31- August 3. Vandalia is one 60 Ohio law enforcement agencies to hold the CALEA designation (of 850 total agencies statewide). Our assessor will be retired Chief Charles Walters from Gwinnett County (GA) Police Department. During this week, Chief Walters will be meeting with various members of VPD, city leaders, community members, and business owners to receive input and feedback on our policies and procedures and community interactions.

The **Foley and Enola Drive Reconstruction** project is complete. Double Jay Construction was our contractor for this project, and they were great to work with and very accommodating to our residents. GIS / Engineering Tech Chad Baughman did a great job of managing the project and keeping our resident informed of what was going on and what to expect next throughout the project.

**Human Resources Personnel Administration Policy 2-11 on Dress Code and Appearance:** I have issued an updated policy for employee dress code and appearance. Thank you to our Senior Staff for the hard work and input regarding this policy. Employees are now permitted to display tattoos and piercings with some restrictions. Our team will continue to present in a professional and respectful way that ensures confidence and is representative of the great public services that our team provides. This is a great move for the City of Vandalia. There are several other noteworthy changes – if you are *in to* reading policies.

**Clyde / Cyril Reconstruction Project:** The City is advertising for bids for the Clyde Place and Cyril Court Reconstruction project. Bids will be opened on August 15th and this item will be on the August 21st Council Study Session agenda for discussion.

**Refuse Bids:** The City will be opening bids for our Municipal Refuse and Recycling collection on July 28th and have this information for discussion at the August 21st City Council Study Session.

**Public Works Facility:** Our team has reviewed statements of qualifications from 12 firms for the engineering and design of our new Public Works Facility. Our committee has narrowed the list down to six and have interviews set up with those firms in the next couple weeks.

**Mosquito Spraying:** Public Health has notified me that they plan to do mosquito spraying on Monday July 24th at dusk. Please consider the following:

- 1) Public Health will spray in the area around the Vandalia Rec Center/Vandalia Sports Complex, around Helke Park and then a small route through Poplar Cemetery.
- 2) Signs will be placed on the morning of 7/24 with contact information.

**Parking Prohibitions:** The "No Parking" signs have been installed on Industrial Park Drive and Scholz Drive prohibiting parking from 9:00pm to 5:00am. **Vegetation Control:** Public Works is continuing with our vegetation control along and in our roadways. Crews have been in the residential neighborhood spraying along the curbs.

be held Monday, August 21 at 7:00 p.m. The Study Session will tentatively begin at 6:00 p.m.

2-11 Employee Appearance and Dress Code

#### 2-11.0 Purpose:

The City of Vandalia shall establish general guidelines defining appropriate attire and appearance standards for City of Vandalia employees. All employees shall have a neat and professional appearance that reflects well upon the City of Vandalia. Appearance plays a key role in portraying the professionalism of our City government. This policy is necessary to create and to maintain a professional image of municipal operations for the public, while ensuring an appropriate and safe work environment. All employees of the City are expected and encouraged to exercise discretion and good taste in their matter of dress. Each employee's attire, grooming and personal hygiene should be appropriate to the work situation.

#### 2-11.1 Introduction of Standards:

Each Department Director, subject to review by the Human Resources Manager, is authorized to develop and to implement additional policies or general orders relating to employee personal appearance and dress code, which shall not conflict with this policy.

Department Directors, their designee, or the Human Resources Manager shall be charged with investigating complaints or observations relating to potential infractions of this policy. Any employee who does not meet personal appearance and dress code standards or departmental policies may be subject to corrective disciplinary action.

No employee shall be permitted to perform their duties while wearing clothing, jewelry, tattoos, piercings, body modifications, or other body art that is offensive, detrimental, or distracting to the department, division, or City (for example, references to discrimination, violence, gangs or organized crime, an illegal act, racism, swastika, confederate flag, supremacism, affiliation with an extremist group, drug use, nudity, sexually explicit acts, sexually suggestive references, other derogatory material, obscenity, profanity, an attack based on a protected class or status, an attack of another employee or person, or see-through clothing).

If an employee is required to leave work in order to comply with this policy, it shall be recorded as unpaid leave.

#### 2-11.2 Standards for Uniformed Personnel:

<u>Uniformed Personnel:</u> All employees who are provided with a City uniform shall report to work each day in a clean uniform. Uniforms, including City supplied t-shirts, shall not be altered (for example, cutting off sleeves) in any manner, excluding professional tailoring of uniforms. Any questions regarding City-provided uniforms should be directed to the appropriate Department Director or the Human Resources Manager.

Uniformed personnel shall not be permitted to wear hats (except for winter hats not bearing another organization's logo or name), shirts, or light jackets that are not provided by the City of Vandalia. City uniforms shall not be worn when the employee is off duty unless authorized by the Department Director or City

#### RECREATION / ATHLETICS DIVISION / SPECIAL EVENTS

- The first Summer Splashtacular event took place on July 11 at the Sports Complex with a great turnout. This program was started during the COVID pandemic as a way for children to get outside and participate in water themed activities. The Parks and Recreation Department and Division of Fire partner to provide this free activity. The July 18 event was cancelled due to cloudy skies and cool weather. The remaining Splashtacular event will take place on July 25 at the Sports Complex.
- The Vandalia Air Show Backyard Bash, sponsored by Minster Bank will take place this Thursday, July 20 at the Art Park and will include the United States Air Force Band of Flight. There will be food trucks, activities for kids, inflatables, vendors, arts & crafts and more! We are keeping our fingers crossed for good weather.
- The Schellas Hyndman Soccer Camp was held the week of July 10-14 at the Sports Complex with 85 youngsters participating. The Butler High School soccer teams and coaches assisted with the camp as instructors. Schellas is a 1969 Butler graduate who went on to become a highly decorated soccer player and hall of fame coach at the collegiate and professional levels. We appreciated Coach Hyndman donating his time for the community that means so much to him. We are hopeful to offer the camp again next year.
- Cassel Hills Swimming Pool I appreciate the opportunity to present a mid-season report to City Council at the July 17 meeting. As discussed, attendance is driven by weather conditions and as a follow up here are some recent attendance numbers and weather conditions:
  - $\circ$  July 6 rain and poor weather 54 total patrons
  - $\circ$  July 7 sunny and warm 385 total patrons
  - July 15 cloudy and rain 43 total patrons
  - July 16 sunny and warm 248 total patrons
- A total of 11 mid-season passes to Cassel Hills Pool have been processed for a total revenue of \$833.
- Our youth soccer program currently has a total of 315 youngsters registered to participate in the recreational program for a total of 30 teams. The number of participants is down slightly from our five year average of 324 per season.
- A total of 30 kids participated in the Playtime at the Park program on July 10 at Helke Park.
   Participants enjoyed many yard games, small arts & crafts and Kona Ice as part of the program.

#### RECREATION CENTER

- The At The Rec program guide for September through December has been finalized and ready for printing. The guide will include all programs, activities and special events for the Autumn time period.
- We are into the 8<sup>th</sup> week of Summer CampRec. This is Super Science Week with lots of fun activities planned, including a field trip to COSI, STEM presentations by the Boonshoft Museum and much more. We have 3 more weeks of camp scheduled after this current week.
- Several recreation staff will be attending an Ohio Parks and Recreation Association Special Events Workshop in Dublin on September 22. The workshop will cover sponsorships, best practices for planning your next event and is a great opportunity to strengthen a peer network.
- o Insurance Based Memberships at the VRC totaled 1009 for June with 2980 visits, up slightly from 2022. We had 3257 daily admissions in June accounting for \$23,832 in revenue.

#### **SENIOR CITIZENS CENTER**

- O Van Tran continues to thrive as a service to our senior population. Nearly every day is at capacity for the number of trips available and every volunteer driver is working 6 to 8 hours each week.
- For the period of July 5 to July 18 there were 914 people pass through the doors of the Senior Center, including evenings and weekends. Lunch and Learns as well as Bingo continue to attract large crowds to the facility.

#### **FACILITY MAINTENANCE DIVISION**

- Site work is underway for the new Helke Park playground unit. The new unit will be located in the area of the horseshoe pits and shuffleboard courts. Staff has removed fencing and light pole bases in this area in anticipation of the arrival of the playground installation contractor this week. Once onsite, the installer is estimated to take two weeks to complete the installation. They will then move to the Sports Complex to complete the demolition of the current playground unit on the baseball side of the complex, followed by installation of the new unit. We are appreciative for the assistance provided by Public Works in locating the water service line in this area of Helke Park and for use of their equipment in the demolition of concrete pole bases.
- Parks Maintenance Technicians worked with Public Works on the cleaning of the paver areas and sidewalks in the National Road and Dixie Drive streetscape areas. Staff moved debris into the curb where the street sweeper picked it up.
- O Staff performed some maintenance work on the Disc Golf Course at Helke Park, removing downed limbs and mowing some wooded areas that will improve playability of the course.
- Facilities Infrastructure Project Light poles are being installed along the east pathway at the Sports Complex. The contractor has installed a total of 12 poles and continues to work toward the installation of all 32 poles in the coming week. The installed pole lights (solar/LED) are in operation and are providing excellent lighting of the pathway during early morning and evening time periods.
- Landscape maintenance work continues at various city facilities and parks including Cassel Hills Pool, Justice Center, Municipal Building, Seger Park and the Senior Center. Work performed includes shrub pruning, weed control and mulching.

- 1. During the past three weeks, VPD officers made 18 traffic stops on commercial motor vehicles for traffic violations. These stops resulted in five traffic citations, 12 written warnings and one verbal warning while working 16 additional enforcement hours.
- 2. Lieutenant Walker, Lieutenant Sucher, Officer Large, and I took a tour of the Kendall Electric construction site off Center Drive on July 11. We met with Shook Construction Project Manager Melissa Lear who escorted us around the facility that is scheduled for completion in September. We made preliminary plans to visit the site one more time before opening, when the construction is nearly completed. The purpose of our tour was to gain first-hand knowledge of the interior of the facility in case of a future emergency.
- 3. Detectives charged a 58-year-old Dayton man with Felonious Assault (Serious Physical Harm). The victim sustained a fractured orbital wall (eye socket) and fractured ribs. A felony warrant was issued, and the suspect turned himself into Vandalia Municipal Court on July 17. The suspect was taken into custody and transported to the Montgomery County Jail.
- 4. Sergeant Wehner and Sergeant Lawson provided "Run, Hide, Fight" training to approximately 40 staff members of UFCW 75 on Poe Avenue. Staff members came from throughout the state to attend a meeting and this training. United Food and Commercial Workers (UFCW) Local 75 is a union of 30,000 workers throughout Ohio, Kentucky, and Indiana. Members of Local 75 work in supermarkets, drug stores, food processing and packing plants, and health care facilities.
- Lieutenant Sucher received notification VPD was awarded \$13,923.26 through the Ohio Law Enforcement Body Armor Grant. This annual award will go toward the purchase of body armor for new officers and replacement armor to keep up with life cycle replacement.
- 6. Officer Clymer stopped a vehicle for speed. He identified a 27-year old female out of Detroit, Michigan, who possessed a firearm and was under several felony drug related indictments. Detectives obtained charges for weapons under disability (F3), carrying a concealed weapon (F4), and improper handling of a firearm (F4).

- 7. Detectives obtained a warrant for the arrest of a 40-year-old Dayton man for one count of Voyeurism and one count of Criminal Trespass. These charges stem from an incident at the Red Robin restaurant where the suspect entered the women's bathroom and filmed an adult female using the restroom on his cell phone.
- 8. VPD held its annual retirees' range shooting qualifications on Saturday, July 15 at the Sheriff's Office Range on Old Webster Street. We had 17 retired Vandalia officers attend this shooting qualification course that meets the state's standards and permits retired officers to carry a firearm under the Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act (LEOSA) federal legislation. Special thanks to range officers Brian Krimm and Michael Hulbert for hosting this training. I enjoyed seeing many of our retirees and wish them the best.
- 9. Sergeant Wehner's promotional ceremony occurred during Monday evening's Council meeting with you administering his Oath of Office and badge pinning by his mentor Shelby County Sheriff James Frye.
- 10. Sergeants Wehner and Lawson held an Explorer Meeting on July 18 where they continued training on radar and lidar from the previous meeting. They also seized this opportunity to go out and do practical exercises with traffic using the various speed measuring devices. Explorers then learned about the Flock camera system and the information it provides. The upcoming Air Show and scheduling was discussed as we look forward to assistance from the Explorers while they help throughout the weekend.
- 11. I attended the monthly meeting on Thursday with VBSD Superintendent O'Leary, Safety Director Bill Wertz and Butler Twp. Police Chief John Porter. Our monthly meetings include conversations on school safety and community concerns for the safety of our students and school staff.
- 12. VPD's CALEA on-site assessment will occur July 31- August 3. Our assessor will be retired Chief Charles Walters from Gwinnett County (GA) Police Department. During this week, Chief Walters will be meeting with various members of VPD, city leaders, community members, and business owners to receive input and feedback on our policies and procedures and community interactions.

#### **Development & Engineering Services**

The Foley and Enola Drive Reconstruction project is now completed. Double Jay Construction was our contractor for this project and they were great to work with and very accommodating to our residents. Chad Baughman also did a great job of managing the project and keeping our resident informed of what was going on and what to expect next throughout the project.

Outdoor Enterprise in completing the fence replacement/installation on the Dog Leg Road Utility project. This completes this project as well, except the installation of the electric service to the sanitary sewer lift station. Once AES provides the service drop the final connection will be made. We were also very happy with Outdoor Enterprise's work on this project.

Finfrock Construction should be wrapping up the concrete repair project within the next couple weeks. They are currently working on Poplar Grove Drive, Birchton Place and Great Hill Drive. Ronald Drive will be the last street to complete the project.

Brumbaugh Construction is close to completion of the Airport Access Road Bridge Rehabilitation project. All lanes of traffic should be open this weekend for the Air Show.

We are currently advertising for bids for the Clyde Place and Cyril Court Reconstruction project. Bids will be opened on August 15<sup>th</sup> and this item will be on the August 21<sup>st</sup> Council Study Session agenda for discussion.

We will be opening bids for our Municipal Refuse and Recycling collection on July 28<sup>th</sup> and have this information for discussion at the August 21st City Council Study Session.

We have reviewed Statement of Qualifications from 12 firms for the engineering and design of our new Public Works Facility. We have narrowed the list down to six and have interviews set up with those firms in the next couple weeks.

Our new fee schedule for all permits, including water and sanitary sewer taps, have been implemented beginning July 19<sup>th</sup>. Our software, all forms and website have been updated accordingly

#### **Public Works**

Much of this period has been spent preparing for the Air Show and parade. We have been mowing and trimming areas and installing the signage for directing traffic. We will be providing traffic control Friday evening for the parade and assisting with traffic control items the days of the Show.

The "No Parking" signs have been installed on Industrial Park Drive and Scholz Drive prohibiting parking from 9:00pm to 5:00am.

We placed the temporary "No Parking" signs at various locations around the City for the Air show.

Our crews rebuilt a catch basin on Northwoods Boulevard where a large area had washed out and undermined the roadway. This was discovered by the survey crews in their work on the design of the DIA NE Logistics Roadway project.

We are continuing with our vegetation control along and in our roadways. Crews have been in the residential neighborhood spraying along the curbs.

We continue with our water meter replacement. The batteries on the old meter transmitters are continuing to fail at a rapid pace. There are 30-40 new ones each month. Public Works crews assisted us on Clyde Place and Cyril Court by uncovering the gas main with our Hydro Vac to determine the depth for the design of our storm sewer.

We have finally taken delivery of the tandem axle dump truck from K.E. Rose with the dump body and all of the snow & ice equipment installed. We ordered this truck in October of 2021. We will have this truck for display at the Municipal Building prior to an upcoming Council Meeting.

Jake Hayslett and Ben Borton attended the Tri Cities Waste Water Technical Committee meeting during this period.

#### **Community Electric Aggregation Program FAQs v.12.20**

### How is my community able to choose a certified electric generation supplier on my behalf?

Under government aggregation, local officials bring citizens together to gain group buying power for the purchase of competitively priced electricity from a retail electric generation supplier certified by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO). Residents voted to allow the community to contract with an electric generation supplier on their behalf. Your community has selected Energy Harbor to provide you with exclusive pricing on your electric generation.

#### Who is Energy Harbor?

Energy Harbor is a fully integrated retail energy provider and independent power producer capable of generating substantial carbon-free energy. Headquartered in Akron, Ohio, the company proudly serves nearly one million residential, commercial, and industrial customers in Ohio, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Maryland, Illinois and Michigan. Your community is one of over 200 who have chosen Energy Harbor to provide electric aggregation programs.

#### What does it mean to have a fixed price?

The price you will receive each month does not change.

### How will I know if I can save money in the aggregation?

You'll know you are saving money as long as your price with Energy Harbor is lower than the utility Price to Compare (PTC) communicated on your bill.

#### Why am I receiving this letter if I'm in the aggregation?

As a current member of your community's electric aggregation program, you are given the opportunity to opt out of the program at least every three years. Whether your current contract term with Energy Harbor, or another supplier, is coming to an end, this is your opportunity to either opt out or continue the benefits of the program.

#### What does it mean to opt out?

Opt out means that you can decide to not participate in your community's electric aggregation program. #### What happens if I do not opt out?

Yes, you may leave the aggregation program at any time. You will not be charged an early termination or cancellation fee if you choose to leave the program at later date for any reason.

#### What are my energy supply choices if I decide to opt out?

If you opt out or leave the program at a later date you will be returned to your utility's standard service offer and might not be served under the same rates, terms, or conditions that apply to other customers served by the electric utility. You may also shop for an alternative generation supplier. A list of competitive electric suppliers certified by the PUCO and their current prices are available by calling 1-800-686-PUCO (7826).

### <sup>1</sup>As part of the aggregation, will Energy Harbor continue or allow me to begin to budget bill my supplier charges?

Yes. For customers in Toledo Edison, The Illuminating Company, Ohio Edison and Duke Energy your utility includes supplier charges in the monthly budgeted amount. No action is necessary to continue that service. In AEP Ohio and AES Ohio service areas, budget billing will automatically be provided to eligible residents who currently have budget billing with their utility and at least 10 months of historical usage at their current service address. If you have less than 10 months of usage, you will still receive the community exclusive pricing listed herein but will be ineligible to budget the generation portion of your bill. AEP Ohio and AES Ohio will continue to budget the delivery portion of your bill. Under budget billing service, Energy Harbor will calculate your budgeted amount based on your average electric usage over the prior months. Periodically, Energy Harbor may examine your budget and may adjust to more closely match your usage from the previous year. Energy Harbor will conduct a final true-up at the end of the contract - or upon your leaving the program should you 'opt out' before the program term end - to reconcile between the actual amount of electricity used and the amount paid under the plan. The new budget amount may vary from the level of your current budget payment. You will continue to receive a levelized amount from your utility for delivery service and may experience true ups with your utility during the contract. #### Who is not eligible for an electric aggregation program?

Customers on a special arrangement with the utility such as net-metering, Percentage of Income Payment Plan (PIPP), and mercantile customers who have not provided affirmative consent to join are not eligible for the program.

Dear Sports Complex Neighbor,

In the next few weeks the City of Vandalia will be installing solar powered pole lights on the east loop of the walking path at the Sports Complex (map enclosed). The lighting level provided is intended to provide a level of comfort/safety for those who may wish to use this portion of the path at dusk or dawn. It is not intended to provide high levels of lighting that might be typical on public rights of way such as roadways and adjacent sidewalks.

These fixtures were selected, in part, due to their ability to function without the need to connect them to an electric source. Each fixture comes with its own solar panel to charge a battery during daylight hours then use that battery to provide light after dark. These fixtures are also designed to minimize light pollution by focusing all of the light generated to the area intended to be lit. All fixtures are also being installed with a backlight shield intended to minimize any light spillover into adjacent residents' property.


Onboard controls allow us to program how and when the fixtures function. These fixtures will initially be set to come on at 100% at dusk for 3 hours, dim to 30% brightness throughout the night, then brighten to 100% one hour before dawn until turning themselves off at dawn.

The section of the walking path being lit was determined by matching available funds to the area of the complex that we believe will benefit most from this initial effort. Additional sections of the walking path may be lit in the future as funding allows.

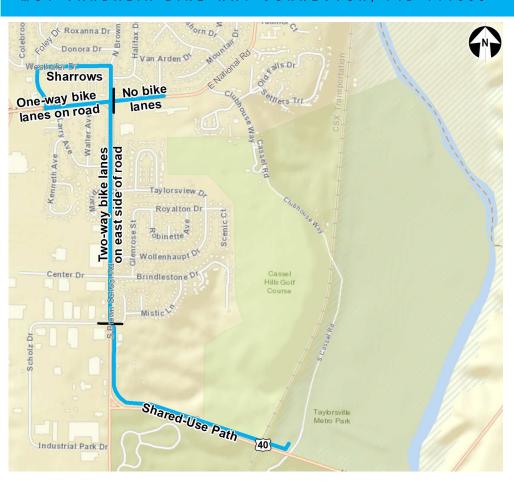

### Vandalia Bikeway Connector

MOT-VANDALIA BIKE-WAY CONNECTOR, PID 11138



**What does this project involve?** The City of Vandalia proposes to provide a bicycle-friendly connection from Old National Road Trail at Interstate 75 to the Great Miami Recreation Trail at Taylorsville MetroPark, just north of US-40 near South Cassel Road. Under the project, the following improvements are proposed:

- Provide sharrows on Foley Drive, Westhafer Road, and North Brown School Road (north of National Road).
- Provide one-way bike lanes on each side of National Road, from Foley Drive to South Brown School Road.
- Restripe South Brown School Road, from National Road to the intersection of Scholz Drive/Cassel Creek Drive, to provide two-way separated bike lanes on the east side of South Brown School Road, with flexible delineators between the two-way, buffered bike lanes and motor vehicle lanes. These will be positioned to accommodate driveways.
- South of the intersection of Scholz Drive/Cassel Creek Drive, construct a 10-foot-wide multi-use trail. This trail will extend from the intersection of Scholz Drive/Cassel Creek Drive to US-40 and along US-40 to Taylorsville Metro-Park, just north of US-40 near South Cassel Road.

**Why is this project needed?** The Great Miami River Recreational Trail offers over 330 miles of trail system in southwestern Ohio. Although the Great Miami Recreation Trail extends through eastern Vandalia, there is a lack of bicycle-friendly access routes to the Trail for our citizens.

How much will this project cost and how is it funded? The current estimated construction cost is approximately \$2.88-million. The City has been awarded \$2.53-million in Congestion Mitigation & Air Quality (CMAQ) funds; the remaining costs will be the responsibility of the City of Vandalia.

Who proposed this project and who is responsible for oversight? The City of Vandalia applied for and received federal transportation funds through the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission. ODOT, as steward of the federal funds, will provide oversight of the project.

**What acquisition is required for this project?** The project is expected to require property acquisition from private citizens along Brown School Road, between Cassel Creek Drive and US-40. This acquisition will be limited to minor strip takes. Most of the project will occur on publicly-owned lands.



Why does the project include on-road components? Why not provide a multi-use trail connection for the entire length? When constructed to desired standards, multi-use trails are very land hungry. Including shoulders and clear zones, a design-standard multi-use trail has a total width of 20 feet. This makes multi-use trail construction problematic in developed areas, where the necessary land is not available without taking private property. On-road options, such as designated bike lanes or pavement markings & signage, allow for bicycle-friendly facilities with minimal impacts to private property.

What is a sharrow? A sharrow (see image to the left) is a pavement mark-

ing that is often used in locations where cyclists and motorists

share the travel lane. It clarifies where cyclists should ride and alerts motorists to expect cyclists on the road.

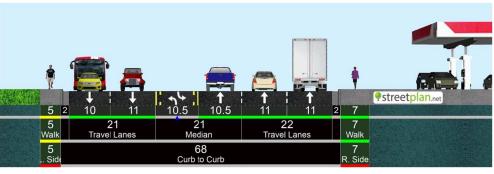
How will the two-way separated bike lanes transition through intersections and drive entrances? Dashed green pavement markings (similar to the image at right) will be provided to alert both cyclists and motor vehicles of the two-way separated bike lanes crossing at all public street intersections. At Brown School Road and National Road, there will be bike boxes where cyclists can wait to complete their two-stage crossing. The north-south crossing of National Road will also have bicycle signals.

Will the project include any pedestrian improvements? Yes. The proposed multi-use trail will accommodate both cyclists and pedestrians. The project will also upgrade existing crosswalks along National Road and Brown School Road. Additionally, all pedestrian facilities that are impacted by construction of these proposed improvements will be evaluated and upgraded as needed for ADA-compliance.

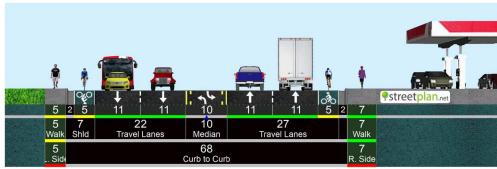


How will the bike lanes and two-way separated bike lanes be able to fit on the existing road? Will travel lanes be lost? The bike lanes and twoway separated bike lanes will be installed by restriping the existing roadway pavement. On National Road, the outside eastbound through travel lane will be eliminated—see images at right. On Brown School Road. the outside northbound through/ right lane just north of Wollenhaupt Drive and southbound right turn lanes will be eliminated.

How will the loss of lanes affect congestion in the corridor? A traffic analysis using simulation and modeling was completed and determined that

these roadways will continue to operate at acceptable levels of service with the removal of these lanes. In general, motor vehicle travel through these corridors is expected to increase between 0.1 and 4.1 seconds in 2020 peak hours and between 0.1 and 2.5 seconds in the 2040 peak hours.

Will the project affect historic or archaeological resources? Within the project area, there are no National Historic Landmarks or sites that are listed on or have been determined eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. Additional assessment will be undertaken and project modifications to avoid/minimize impacts to archaeological resources will be implemented, if necessary. We welcome your thoughts regarding the historic character of the project corridor and the effect of the project. Will access to Taylorsville MetroPark be affected? Will the project negatively affect any existing recreational features associated with the MetroPark? Access to Taylorsville MetroPark, outside of the established construction limits, will be maintained throughout construction. The project will provide improved access to the MetroPark. The project will not alter or eliminate any existing recreational facilities at the MetroPark.

**Will lighting be provided on the multi-use trail?** No. As a publicly-owned recreational facility, the trail will be open during daylight hours. Therefore, lighting for the trail is not needed. Existing lighting on National Road and Brown School Road will remain.

**Will the project include work in waterways or wetlands?** The project will be evaluated and, where appropriate, the design will be modified to avoid or minimize impacts to streams and wetlands. All necessary permits for stream and wetland impacts will be obtained prior to construction.

**How will the project affect the floodplain?** The project will be designed to comply with the National Flood Insurance Program and will not result in an unacceptable increase in the base flood elevation. The design will be coordinated with the Miami Conservancy District to accommodate a net zero change in the retention basin capacity of Taylorsville Dam.

How will the project affect RTA bus stops in the corridor? RTA Route 17 has a part-time loop through the project area—National Road to Brown School Road to Center Drive. The bus stops for this route will remain open during construction.

What is the schedule for the project? The project is currently in preliminary design. Final plans are expected to be completed in February 2024. Based on the current schedule, the project is expected to begin construction in July 2024 and require approximately eleven months to construct.

Why can't the project be undertaken sooner? Many factors go into developing a schedule for construction of a federal-aid project of this size. In addition to providing time for data collection, project design and quality control review, the schedule must also provide for public involvement, environmental review, environmental permitting, right-of-way negotiations, and utility relocations.

How will traffic on National Road, US-40 and Brown School Road be maintained during construction? Most construction activities along National Road and Brown School Road consist of signing and pavement marking changes which will be done at night or during evening hours. Signal work may require closure of curb lanes for placing foundations, pull boxes, signal supports, etc. Construction along US 40 and west of the dam will be confined to off-road locations with impact to US 40 limited to flaggers while setting the prefabricated bridge truss over CSX railroad, which could be completed at night.

Will the project require a detour of Old National Road Trail or the Great Miami Recreation Trail during construction? The project team will seek to maintain traffic on the Great Miami Recreation Trail during daylight hours. However, if day-time closures of more than 15-minutes are required, flaggers, signed detours and advance notice of the closures will be provided.

What is the current status of decision-making on this project? No final decisions regarding any proposed improvements have been made at this time. We are seeking public input, in order to ensure the best possible decisions are made for our community. We welcome your input and encourage you to provide comments.





#### **Veteran Banners**

On Memorial Day, 2023, drivers using Dixie Drive, also known as Veterans Parkway in Vandalia and Butler Township had a very visual representation of what the holiday truly means. The week prior, Vandalia and Butler Township had completed the installation of 151 Veteran banners.

Installed from Stop Eight Road through to National Road, the banners were purchased by family members of those who have served in the United States military.

The project was a joint effort between the Vandalia-Butler Chamber of Commerce, the City of Vandalia and Butler Township.

The banners will be displayed along Veterans Parkway through 2024, then presented to the families who purchased them. A new group of banners will be installed in time for Memorial Day, 2025.



This photo honors a soldier killed in the US Civil War. With no available photo of the veteran, organizers used a photo of a statue of Private George Washington Fair. The limestone statue was dedicated in 1884 at the intersection of Main and Monument, and eventually became so weathered that it was moved to a porched in area at the Dayton VA Medical Center. A bronze replica of the original statue is displayed in Dayton's downtown.

### **Family Purchases City's First Habitat For Humanity Home**

For Tiffany Brown, a mother of four children, renting is all that her family has ever known. Although Tiffany has lived in apartments since before her children were born, she has dreamed of owning a home. In June of this year, Tiffany and her family saw the dream of home ownership become a reality.

The family moved into a home on Foley Drive built through Habitat for Humanity of Greater Dayton.

The lot had once been the site of a home that had fallen into disrepair. The owners had abandoned the structure, and it reached a point where it was no longer financially feasible to make repairs. The only option was to tear the building down.

"We try very hard to work with the homeowners whenever there is an issue with property upkeep," said Rob Cron, Vandalia Public Service Director. "The residents in the neighborhood have every right to expect homes to be kept to some standard, and razing a building is a last resort when we've exhausted all other avenues for code compliance." Once the home was taken down, the City of Vandalia reached out to the Dayton Habitat for Humanity office and offered to donate the lot to the non-profit.

Ms. Brown was accepted into the Habitat program in 2019, which requires a good amount of dedication from the prospective homeowner. She contributed 295 hours of "sweat equity" working on the home. She also attended home ownership classes to prepare for this new chapter in her life.

Former U.S. Senator Rob Portman, a longtime supporter of Habitat for Humanity, worked on the home in late 2022 and made it a point to drive up to Vandalia for the dedication. He presented the Browns with a United States flag that had been flown over the U.S. Capitol Building.

Habitat spokesperson Dave Mauch said that the City of Vandalia played a key role in making this house a reality. "Dan Wendt and his team have been really fantastic," Mauch said. "We really appreciate him and all he did to make this happen."

### **Aggregation Update**

City of Vandalia residents deciding whether to remain part of the City's natural gas and electricity aggregation program now have a contracted electric rate to consider. In June, the Miami Valley Communications Council accepted a contracted rate for electricity obtained by the Palmer Energy Group of Toledo.

The electric rate, which is guaranteed through December 2025, is .06570/kWh. For comparison, this rate is 4.77% below the rate recently set for Butler Township residents, 31.9% below the City of Dayton rate, and 39.17% below the standard AES rate.

The new rate is expected to begin appearing on Vandalia utility bills in October, 2023.

The organization is still working to negotiate a natural gas rate. There has been no timetable set on when that rate might be set.

"This is the latest step in a process that began in November of last year when Vandalia residents



overwhelmingly approved two ballot issues authorizing the City to negotiate natural gas and electric rates on their behalf," said Dan Wendt, Vandalia City Manager. "We are impressed with the electric rate that Vandalia, and our aggregation partners, were able to secure."

Vandalia residents eligible for aggregation received a letter outlining the new rate and giving them the option to opt out of the aggregation if they choose.

There is no penalty for leaving the aggregation, so at any time within the term of the contract a resident may opt out with no penalty.

If a resident who opts out wishes to join the aggregation, they may do so at any time.

## City honors volunteers, board and commission members

To remain a top-tier suburb in the Dayton region, the City of Vandalia relies on the volunteer efforts of its residents. On Tuesday, May 3, the City honored all of its volunteers with an Appreciation Dinner.

"So much of what we do is impacted by the work of caring and dedicated volunteers who serve on our boards and commissions and help us to continue to provide the best possible services for our residents," said Vandalia Mayor Richard Herbst. "Boards and Committees typically meet in evening hours and they consider issues that have an impact on our quality of life. For the tidy sum of zero dollars and zero cents, these volunteers are willing to put in time to help make this city run."

### **Road Resurfacing**

The road is much smoother to ride in parts of Vandalia following the completion of the City's annual road resurfacing project. In 2023, the City spent \$1.4 million to resurface 22 sections of roadway.

The resurfacing of roadways is a twostep process.

First, concrete contractors move in and repair any damage to sidewalks and curbs. The contractors also install wheelchair accessible ramps at all intersections. To date, roughly 75% of Vandalia's sidewalks have ramps that are in compliance with the Americans With Disabilities Act.

Unlike some neighboring communities, Vandalia residents are not assessed for any of the repairs done to sidewalks or curbs. The Safe and Stable income tax issue, passed in 2010, funds the majority of the work.

Once the concrete work is completed, asphalt contractors move in. First, crews mill off the top 1.5 inches of old asphalt, then resurface with a fresh 1.5 inches of new asphalt.

There are many factors taken into consideration when planning which streets will be resurfaced in any given year. Staff from the Department of Development and Engineering Services keep extensive notes on the condition of all City roadways. The roads are driven on a regular basis so the wear and tear of each can be noted.

When determining the streets to be resurfaced, the condition of the roadway is just one factor. The City also prioritizes those streets that see the most traffic, as their condition impacts the most drivers. Finally, the City considers any future plans

for a roadway. If a water main replacement project is planned on a roadway in the foreseeable future,

the road may not be scheduled for resurfacing until that work is done.

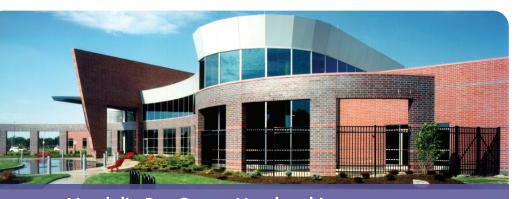

### My Vandalia App **Enhances** Communication with City

The City of Vandalia's public service app, My Vandalia, is making it easy for residents to report issues and check the progress of their concerns. The app is downloadable for free on Google Play and the App Store.







## **Hyper-Reach Messages in Action**

On May 11 of this year, a seven-yearold boy was reported missing in the Timberwind area of Vandalia. The Division of Police and the Division of Fire were quick to set up a command post to find the boy.

One of the first actions they took was to issue a Hyper-Reach message to all addresses in the area the boy was last seen. Hyper-Reach can very quickly send a message to every registered phone in a geographic area to alert as many people as possible to an emergency situation. Within a couple hours, the boy was found safe.

Hyper-Reach has access to every listed landline number. Many households, however, no longer have a land line and instead use only a cell phone. In order to receive these messages, residents must register their cell phone numbers with Hyper-Reach.

Hyper-Reach messages may also be sent in the event of severe weather, an important road closure, or some other situation that requires fast, widespread notification.

You can register your number by logging onto the City of Vandalia website and clicking on the Hyper-Reach pull down menu on the top right corner of the page. You can also register by scanning the QR code below.

HUMAN RESOURCES - Personnel Administration Policy
2-11 Employee Appearance and Dress Code

#### 2-11.0 Purpose:

The City of Vandalia shall establish general guidelines defining appropriate attire and appearance standards for City of Vandalia employees. All employees shall have a neat and professional appearance that reflects well upon the City of Vandalia. Appearance plays a key role in portraying the professionalism of our City government. This policy is necessary to create and to maintain a professional image of municipal operations for the public, while ensuring an appropriate and safe work environment. All employees of the City are expected and encouraged to exercise discretion and good taste in their matter of dress. Each employee's attire, grooming and personal hygiene should be appropriate to the work situation.

#### 2-11.1 Introduction of Standards:

Each Department Director, subject to review by the Human Resources Manager, is authorized to develop and to implement additional policies or general orders relating to employee personal appearance and dress code, which shall not conflict with this policy.

Department Directors, their designee, or the Human Resources Manager shall be charged with investigating complaints or observations relating to potential infractions of this policy. Any employee who does not meet personal appearance and dress code standards or departmental policies may be subject to corrective disciplinary action.

No employee shall be permitted to perform their duties while wearing clothing, jewelry, tattoos, piercings, body modifications, or other body art that is offensive, detrimental, or distracting to the department, division, or City (for example, references to discrimination, violence, gangs or organized crime, an illegal act, racism, swastika, confederate flag, supremacism, affiliation with an extremist group, drug use, nudity, sexually explicit acts, sexually suggestive references, other derogatory material, obscenity, profanity, an attack based on a protected class or status, an attack of another employee or person, or see-through clothing).

If an employee is required to leave work in order to comply with this policy, it shall be recorded as unpaid leave.

#### 2-11.2 Standards for Uniformed Personnel:

<u>Uniformed Personnel:</u> All employees who are provided with a City uniform shall report to work each day in a clean uniform. Uniforms, including City supplied t-shirts, shall not be altered (for example, cutting off sleeves) in any manner, excluding professional tailoring of uniforms. Any questions regarding City-provided uniforms should be directed to the appropriate Department Director or the Human Resources Manager.

Uniformed personnel shall not be permitted to wear hats (except for winter hats not bearing another organization's logo or name), shirts, or light jackets that are not provided by the City of Vandalia. City uniforms shall not be worn when the employee is off duty unless authorized by the Department Director or City

Manager. Uniformed personnel are permitted to wear City uniforms when traveling to and from work. Uniformed personnel are permitted to wear City t-shirts, sweatshirts, and hats when not on duty, and are encouraged to exercise caution and discretion to maintain a professional image that does not bring ill repute to the City organization or any employee.

<u>Shorts:</u> After conferring with the Human Resources Manager, and upon verifying that it is safe and in the interest of the City to do so, Department Directors may permit certain uniformed personnel to wear shorts of an appropriate length and quality in the performance of their duties.

<u>Updated Logos</u>: Effective, January 1, 2024, all uniformed personnel shall be required to comply with the general brand guidelines that were established by the City Council in 2021 and updated logos when wearing City-branded clothing and uniforms.

#### 2-11.3 Standards for Non-Uniformed Personnel:

<u>Non-Uniformed Personnel:</u> Employees who are not provided with a uniform by the City are expected to be properly dressed for the type of work they are performing. Department Directors and supervisors are expected to set clear expectations and to enforce dress code and appearance standards for non-uniformed personnel. Employees are expected to dress in a manner that a reasonable third party would find acceptable in similar business establishments or situations.

City of Vandalia employees are not permitted to wear the following:

- Baggy or poor fitting clothing;
- Jogging suits, sweat suits or other athletic wear (Except when otherwise approved by the Department Director or Human Resources Manager; e.g., fitness instructor, parade duty, participation in Corporate Challenge);
- Loose or unsafe footwear (e.g., Crocs, foam flip-flops);
- Torn, tattered, or worn-out clothing; and
- Distracting or provocative clothing.

Non-uniformed personnel are permitted to wear City t-shirts, sweatshirts, and hats when not on duty, and are encouraged to exercise caution and discretion to maintain a professional image that does not bring ill repute to the City organization or personnel.

<u>Updated Logos:</u> Effective, January 1, 2024, all non-uniformed personnel shall be required to comply with the general brand guidelines that were established by the City Council in 2021 and updated logos when wearing city-branded clothing. Any city logos that are applied to employee-owned clothing to be worn on-duty should be reviewed and approved by the Communications Manager to ensure brand conformity (or ordered through a vendor who has obtained the City's artwork and has been approved by the Communications Manager).

<u>Jeans:</u> Department Directors may permit personnel to wear work appropriate jeans (e.g., those that fit; are of a plain design and cut; are not faded or distressed, do not contain holes, embroidery, sequins, bleaching, acid/stone washing) in the performance of their duties so long as it does not diminish the professional image of the organization. Department Directors reserve the right to revoke such permissions.

<u>Jeans on Fridays:</u> Non-uniformed personnel who are normally not permitted to wear jeans, are permitted to wear work appropriate jeans on Fridays (e.g., those that fit; are of a plain design and cut; are not faded or distressed, do not contain holes, embroidery, sequins, bleaching, acid/stone washing) if it does not detract from the performance of their duties.

<u>Shorts:</u> After conferring with the Human Resources Manager, and upon verifying that it is safe and in the interest of the City to do so, Department Directors may permit certain non-uniformed personnel to wear shorts of an appropriate length and quality in the performance of their duties (e.g., Air Show, parade or special event duty, field work).

<u>Temporary Relaxation of Dress Code Standards:</u> Department Directors may occasionally allow employees to dress in a more casual fashion than is normally required. On these rare occasions, employees are expected to present a neat and work appropriate appearance.

#### 2-11.4 Employee Appreciation Events and Butler High School Spirit Week:

Non-uniformed personnel are permitted to wear work appropriate jeans or shorts to employee appreciation events if it does not detract from the performance of their other duties on that day.

Non-uniformed personnel are permitted to wear appropriate Vandalia Butler City School District attire (e.g., t-shirts, sweatshirts, buttons) with jeans during Butler High School Spirit Week if it does not detract from the performance of their duties. Non-uniformed personnel may wear jeans during spirt week accompanied by Vandalia Butler City School District color combination (i.e., purple and yellow).

The Department Director, at their discretion, may choose to relax certain dress code requirements for uniformed personnel during employee appreciation events or Butler High School Spirit Week.

#### 2-11.5 Tattoos and Scarification:

<u>Tattoos Permitted:</u> Employees may display tattoos (including scarification) during the performance of their duties if it does not violate a work rule, policy, or cause a concern for safety in the opinion of the Department Director or Human Resources Manager.

<u>Prohibitions:</u> No employee shall be permitted to perform their duties while displaying a tattoo or intentional scar that is offensive, detrimental, or distracting to the department, division, or City (for example, tattoos that reference discrimination, violence, gangs or organized crime, an illegal act, racism, swastika, confederate flag, supremacism, affiliation with an extremist group, drug use, nudity, sexually explicit acts, sexually suggestive references, other derogatory material, obscenity, profanity, or an attack based on a protected class or status).

Tattoos are prohibited from being displayed on the head, ears, face, front or sides of the neck, chest, or hands (including the fingers) and must be hidden from view. A tattoo that resembles a wedding ring is permitted on the traditional finger on which a wedding ring is worn, so long as the ring tattoo does not violate any other section of this policy. Tattoos covering the majority of an employee's arms, commonly known as a "sleeve", cannot be displayed beyond the wrist and any further than the base of the hand.

<u>Cosmetics and Permanent Makeup:</u> Tattoos resembling cosmetic or permanent makeup may be permitted if it does not violate any other part of this policy.

Investigation of Complaints and Order to Cover a Tattoo: Upon receiving a complaint or observing a tattoo that may violate a city policy, a supervisor may order an employee to cover a tattoo. The employee shall comply with the order to cover the tattoo. The Department Director, in consultation with the Human Resources Manager, shall determine the appropriate manner for covering the tattoo. Costs associated with covering a tattoo will be at the expense of the employee (except when uniformed personnel are instructed to cover a tattoo with a normal uniform consisting of long sleeves, pants, or hat).

<u>Appeal:</u> An employee may appeal against the order of a Department Director to cover a tattoo. In the case of an appeal, the Human Resources Manager shall evaluate the tattoo and issue a decision in accordance with this policy. The Human Resources Manager's decision shall be final.

#### 2-11.6 Piercings, Other Body Art, and Modifications:

<u>Piercings Permitted:</u> Employees may display piercings, gauging, dermal piercings (i.e., transdermal implants), or subdermal implants during the performance of their duties if it does not violate a work rule, policy, or cause a concern for safety in the opinion of the Department Director or Human Resources Manager.

<u>Prohibitions:</u> No employee shall have intentional abnormal modifications to any area of the body visible to the public while on duty (for example, tongue splitting or bifurcation, abnormal shaping of the ears, eyes, or nose; abnormal filing of the teeth).

<u>Appeal:</u> An employee may appeal against the order of a Department Director to remove or to cover a piercing, or other body art or modification. In the case of an appeal, the Human Resources Manager shall evaluate the piercing or other body art or modification and issue a decision in accordance with this policy. The Human Resources Manager's decision shall be final.

#### 2-11.7 Facial Hair:

<u>Employees outside of the Department of Public Safety:</u> Employees who are not assigned to the Department of Public Safety shall be permitted to grow and to maintain neatly trimmed and well-groomed facial hair.

Employees within the Department of Public Safety: Employees who are assigned to the Department of Public Safety shall comply with standards set by the appropriate Division Chief. If permitted by the Chief, employees shall be required to maintain neatly trimmed and well-groomed facial hair.
